We saw our state teams competing in all age groups, hosting a couple of age groups here in Melbourne. The inaugural year of a National League Team "Phoenix" competing giving all of our athletes pathways to achieve goals and dreams. We have had many of our members being selected in not only National Age Teams but also National Squad's, we would like to congratulate all of those athletes that were selected.

With the lifting of all of the COVID restrictions we have been able to return to pre pandemic times with our competition being able to compete in all levels. We have 742 senior members registered. Our junior competition has 551 members registered. We have also been able to achieve our premier's men's competition being able to compete in a 30 metre pool.

This year has also had some very sad times with the sudden passing of our Executive Officer David Whittaker. He was a friend to many but worked so tirelessly for our sport, not only in the office but was also always on pool deck to encourage and support our up and coming athletes in any way he could.

Financially we are in a sound position. With appointment of our new CEO, Simon Devine in April the goal was to consolidate our financial position.

Due to limited opportunity to run programs and play games, the writing off of bad debt and the COVID refund provided to clubs to pass back onto their members it meant we ran at a loss for the financial year.

From a personal point of view I have been on the board for the past five years, three of them as president. I have enjoyed my time working with many members of our community to try and achieve the best that we can for our sport. Our current board has worked tirelessly through out this Pandemic meeting regularly to try and make sure that our sport stayed financial.

I would also like to acknowledge the hard work that our staff have done over the last year, particularly Thomas Swords and Perri Randall. We would also like to welcome our new Chief Executive Officer, Simon Devine and Regan Longfield, Development officer.

Finally I would like to thank my fellow Board Members for all of there support and collective time that you have all put into our sport to make sure that we achieve the best for our members.

# CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

First of all I want to thank everyone who has welcomed me into the Water Polo family since my arrival in April. In what has been a whirlwind start to my tenure, I can say that everyone was excited to be finally being back in the pool and playing the great game unimpeded by COVID.

Whilst there has been plenty of action in the pool, a lot has been happening out of the pool. Due to the unfortunate and sudden passing of David Whittaker in January this year a number of projects/plans stalled. However over the last couple of months we have been able to get ourselves back on track with our governance structure.

- The By-Laws were given a complete overhaul with feedback provided from all stakeholders throughout the process. These rules that govern our competition will continue to evolve and will be reviewed on a yearly basis, with feedback requested from member clubs.
- We have updated many Water Polo Victoria Policies, adopted several Water Polo Australia Policies, as well as Sports Integrity Australia Policies to ensure we are compliant in all aspects of governance. Our Child Safety Policy is the last one to be finalised and should be completed by the end of the year with engagement from WPA, SIA, CCYP and Victorian Government (the delay is due to all parties agreeing that the new child safe standards in Victoria are met with the updated policy).
- The Water Polo Victoria Constitution is being reviewed and updated. This will be provided to all stakeholders for feedback prior to holding of a Special General Meeting to approve. The ambition was to have this ready for the 2022 AGM but unfortunately due to time restraints couldn't be completed. This will be ready in the first quarter of 2023 after consultation with member clubs.
- The Water Polo Victoria Strategic and Operational Plan is almost complete and work will be finalised once the Constitution has been sent to clubs for review. The alignment of these two documents follows the plans as set out by our National Body (Water Polo Australia), but will have a Victoria flavour to the processes and outcomes that are desired.

Whilst my focus has been about getting Water Polo Victoria back on track from an internal governance perspective the amazing staff that kept the organisation going (Perri Randall – Competitions, Thomas Swords – Administration) have been amazing. With the addition of Regan Longfield in July they have been able to allow me the opportunity to focus on the above tasks while they ensured the competitions, academies, state programs, and other programs were delivered.

To be able to complete a full season of winter water polo was a credit to all involved. To see people of all ages back in the pool was great. The start of summer season saw an increase in total team numbers which is also a positive sign for the sport. Our next challenge is to grow the junior participation of our sport, especially in the female space, and we look forward to working with clubs to achieve that.

To have our academies back from Term 2 onwards was also good to see. Even in the short time we have already seen this program evolve and grow. We want to ensure we engage all athletes who want to get better at this sport and encourage them to try out for academy. Plans are in the works to have a development program to assist those athletes who might not be ready to enter our academy program, but who are still interested in developing their skills. The other project we have in the near future is to launch a regional academy so athletes who don't live in Melbourne also have an opportunity to train/learn in an environment that is closer to home.

Our state program got back to a type of normal with the under 15, under 17 and under 19 teams having a structured training program prior to their respective tournaments. As we build numbers within our sport I'm looking forward to seeing larger squads training within our state teams with athletes pushing each other to get better. We are working towards having two teams in every state squad with a team heading to nationals and another team doing a tour so they can gain experience in a tournament setting.

A number of athletes were selected as representatives on Australian teams well done to Blake Edwards, Lachlan Barclay, Tyson Mutsch, Pavle Macic, Daniel Magasanik, Oliver Purcell, Nicholas Mordes, Jemma Potts and Danny Flahive (referee).

On behalf of Water Polo Victoria, the parents, and the athletes I want to say thank you to all the coaches who gave their time and energy in running the academy and state programs. Without you these programs would be nothing and the experience/improvement the athletes have is down to the work you do. I encourage anyone who is interested in getting involved in coaching please reach out as we want to continue to develop everyone in water polo not only athletes.

Regan Longfield's appointment as development officer was in July 2022 but the work relating to his role began well before he arrived. The opportunity that his appointment has to assist the sport in growing from a participation perspective can be infinite. It has taken a few months for him to get settled but now we are starting to roll out several programs which will get my eyes on the sport of water polo, and hopefully more people in the pool.

- Social Polo – Entry into the sport in a casual, fun and informative environment. Initial 6 week program had participants from varying degrees of ability. We had a number of clubs support the program by providing coaches for sessions. With over 30 unique participants attending and almost 100 participations in total over the six weeks, the group learnt the basic skills of egg-beater kick, head-up freestyle, passing and shooting, as well as playing modified games of Water Polo. This program will continue however we are also looking at developing a “social” competition in 2023.
- Winter Invasion – Engaging winter sports to take up water polo as a preseason alternative. We are working with facilities and winter sports (Soccer, football, netball) clubs to get more people trying the sport. The aim will be that some clubs will make this part of their annual program.
- Polo Pups – Mixed gendered introductory water polo program aimed to extend active aquatic participation of 8-14 aged juniors with teaching proficiency in basic water polo skills that builds upon water safety and swim training competencies.
- Schools – engaging with schools and school organisations to implement Water Polo competitions. Support existing competitions (AGSV, APS, and GSV), but also look at the potential to running new competitions (Gala Days, School Sport Victoria competitions).

I would like to thank the Board of Water Polo Victoria for the support they have given me in my short time in the seat, and I look forward to what we can achieve as a collective in the coming years. I would like to acknowledge my staff, Thomas Swords, Perri Randall and Regan Longfield. I would particularly like to thank Thomas and Perri who worked tirelessly to keep the sport going with David's passing late January. The amount of work they both put in prior to my appointment was extraordinary.

I would like to thank the many individuals that assist us in the sport which includes our referees, our academy/state coaches and our judiciary panel. Many of these roles are volunteer roles and thankless tasks but without them we as a sport wouldn't be able to run many of our programs.

Last and by no means least, I would like to thank the clubs, committees, volunteers, participants, and parents/guardians. Without you to help drive the success of the sport we have nothing. To see so many smiling faces pool side is a testament to the work you all do.

I look forward to working with you all as we continue to grow the sport and showcase how great it is.

# Notes to the Financial Statements

## WATER POLO VICTORIA INCORPORATED

For the year ended 30 June 2022

### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Entity is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. These financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001 .1 The Entity is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the mandatory Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the Corporations Act 2001 and the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the directors have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with those of previous periods unless stated otherwise.

The Entity has concluded that the requirements set out in AASB 10 and AASB 128 are not applicable as the initial assessment on its interests in other entities indicated that it does not have any subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures. Hence, the financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements were authorised for issue on the date shown on the Declaration by the Directors.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

### Income Tax

The entity is exempt from Income Tax.

### Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

### Impairment of Assets

---

These notes should be read in conjunction with the attached compilation report.

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

### **Employee Provisions**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

### **Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

### **Cash on Hand**

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

### **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

### **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

### **Leases**

---

These notes should be read in conjunction with the attached compilation report.

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

### **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

### **Financial Assets**

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

### **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
