PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with pleasure I present the Annual Report for Victorian Water Polo Incorporated (VWPI) for the year 2009/2010.

It has been a fruitful twelve months as VWPI continues to develop, grow and become more sustainable.

I would like to sincerely thank all those who ensure our sport is administered and managed in a professional manner. These people include:

- Board members who have spent a lot of their personal time in managing their various portfolios and in some cases assisting in other areas
- the office staff Gillian Manson, Julie Makohon, Tony Ryan and Carmen Stocks for their ongoing hard work for the development of the sport
- the Marketing sub-committee, who have guided new approaches to support the strategic plan
- the MSAC staff for the support they provide to VWPI
- staff at the VIS, including the program head coach Dalibor Maslan for their ongoing support of our high performance athletes
- tiered program coaches who support the pathway program for promising athletes
- competition co-ordinators, pool controllers, referees, coaches, managers and officials for the Association, regional associations, schools and the clubs who put in such an enormous amount of work to making our sport the success it is
- Schools Sport Victoria and Australia for their support of the Australian schools competition
- AWPI staff and board for their support, in particular of the VIS program and also for their recognition of the ongoing work in Victoria to grow water polo from the grass roots to the elite level
- funding bodies VicHealth and Sport and Recreation Victoria and the contract managers who support the VWPI staff in their work

Congratulations to all those members selected as State, National League and Australian representatives either as players or officials. A particular congratulations to those who were recognized at the AWPI awards including Victoria Brown (Senior Player of the Year), Rowena Webster (member NWPL Team of the Year), Sam McGregor (Senior Player of the Year, member AWPI Team of the Decade and NWPL Team of The Year), Daniel Flahive (Referee of the Year) Also to Sam McGregor and Blake Edwards who have held the captaincy role of the Australian Senior Men's Team and Australian Junior Men's Team respectively, these are significant achievements. The Victorian Tigers club has seen another successful campaign this year the women's team placing 3rd and the men's team 2nd. Our junior state and club teams have also had successful campaigns.

VWPI life members were also recognised, Ian Mills was this year inducted into the AWPI Hall of Fame and Jeanette Gunn was awarded the Harry Quittner medal for services to Women's Water Polo.

The recognition and rewarding of volunteers and players in Victoria for their contribution on an annual basis is an area that I encourage VWPI to address in the near future.

The funding of the Association is supported by members' registrations and match fees. Continuing Government grants were also received from both VicHealth and SRV which contribute to our development programs. These grants will be repeated in the forthcoming year and certainly do assist in implementing the programs in our strategic plan. The funding from VicHealth has been significantly increased as part of a new project that will focus on increasing participation of women and girls at all levels of our sport, from the board and subcommittee level, through to coaches, officials, referees and players. This project will also allow us to focus on sustainable organizational change to support VWPI to further develop a water polo environment that is safer, more accessible, inclusive and equitable. SRV funding will continue to support organisational development and recreational water polo opportunities. Funding arrangements will support additional staffing.

Low female participant numbers is an ongoing challenge for our sport and significant work needs to be done in this area. It is worrying this year that the women's and girls' competitions have been truncated. This indicates that there is a need to look at female leadership across the sport, look at new participation opportunities for women and girls, create an environment for participation that sustains involvement of women and girls and review the balance between high performance and tiered programs and the support of clubs on the ground. This balance is something the new board will need to focus upon.

It was pleasing to see the numbers of U14 and U12 players participating this year, the growth of this age group will be critical to future sustainability of water polo in Victoria. I encourage coaches of these teams to focus on participation rather than competition, allowing more boys and girls and their parents to have fun and build a life long passion and association with the sport we all love.

Another area that presents a challenge to VWPI and all aquatic sports is the availability of facilities to support the growth of introductory, beginner, recreational, competitive and high performance participation. Meeting this challenge will require collaborative approaches to facility development and use at national, state and community levels of the aquatics sector. VWPI has taken some initial steps in this area, developing a pool access strategy and forming closer relationships with more facilities.

The board this year has undergone some significant review and self reflection thanks to a grant from VicHealth that has enabled us to work with vicsport to undergo a governance review. Some items that the board has progressed include:

- development and approval of a new strategic plan, thanks to those who provided input
- further development of a new constitution that is to be presented for consideration by the membership
- development of a governance calendar, board induction program, board roles and responsibilities and a board charter

It is pleasing to see the development of our first full operational plan supported by a fully approved budget to support achieving the strategic plan.

There has been a full contingent on the board for the past couple of years and achieving a diverse board membership of youth, experience, skills, passion and gender balance will be an ongoing challenge and one I put to the new board and membership to work towards. Seeking ever stronger representation at this level, to move the Association forward with strategic leadership, action and by taking firm responsibility to stand accountable for the carriage of water polo in our state is a challenge that requires ongoing commitment and succession planning.

I will not be nominating for the board for the coming year. Having served on the VWPI Board over the last 5 years in a number of positions, including coaching director, secretary and now President, I feel it is time for a change and for new drivers to move the sport forward. I have enjoyed my time on the board and have worked with some great people on the board, staff, from the membership and from our stakeholders organisations. I look forward to continuing to play and be involved at club level.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Throughout the 2010-2011 season, VWPI has had another great year of successes, both in and out of the pool.

Firstly, through VIS coach Dalibor Maslan, the development of players across all age groups has significantly improved. In his first year, Dailbor has been instrumental in introducing the Tier 2 & 3 programs which will hopefully result in many more Tier 1 athletes.

Both our men and women Victorian Tigers had another strong year with both teams making the finals. Congratulations to the women for competing in the finals for the fourth consecutive year and more importantly for winning the bronze medal, their first National League medal since the inception of the women's competition in 2004. The men competed in the national finals for the sixth year in the row, finishing on the podium for the 4th time in as many years. The boys took home a silver medal after a heart breaking loss to the Fremantle Mariners in the grand final.

In addition to the impressive senior results, the juniors have also improved from last year through strong performances across all age groups. Both the boys and girls won various medals in their respective competitions and we look forward to seeing their development grow through the tier programs. Although in their infancy, through the implementation of the tier programs, it will lead to both more significant results and also a greater number of players selected in the junior and senior national squads.

Stepping away from the pool there have also been several other achievements to note. In particular, we were successful in receiving a three year grant from VicHealth to help promote and increase the participation of females, across all ages, playing water polo throughout all levels of the competition. These opportunities do not come around often and through this grant we will continue to increase the exposure and hopefully expand the sport in the wider community.

Another significant achievement throughout 2010-2011 was the induction of several courses run by Victoria Water Polo, which have not been previously available. All

courses were well supported by the greater community and have been an important source of knowledge to our members. In addition to the aforementioned programs the board has focused on the implementation of a new 4 year Strategic Plan, completion of a new Constitution, & creation of a Marketing & Sponsorship plan/committee. Overall I feel it has been a very productive year for the Victorian Water Polo Board.

I would also like to express my excitement at our first international tournament in Melbourne since 2005 World Championships. This is a great opportunity to showcase Victoria and watch great water polo at the inaugural 2012 Pan Pacific Water Polo Championships.

Last but not least I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the following for all of their time and efforts throughout the year:

REPORT OF OPERATIONS – 2010 / 2011

VWPI State Office

Our objectives in the last year have been similar to that of the previous year, and that is to have a focus on continuous improvement across all areas of our operations. Our goal is to establish processes and provide resources that allow the organisation to develop and grow both sustainably and into the long term.

Critical areas of change include:

- In Athlete Development, we have seen the introduction of the of the Tier 2 & 3 programs to provide an athlete development pathway that underpins the VIS program. These programs have come to life with the hard work, passion and dedication of all Coaches involved, and we wish to thank them for their outstanding work, as well as thank the athletes and their families for their commitment
- The Referees Commission continues, and we wish it to be a resource for mentoring and improvement of Referees in Victoria. We will continue to offer Referee courses to keep developing new Referees
- We have undertaken our first Level 1 Coaching course in several years, and the objective of building capacity and knowledge in our coaches at all levels
- We have created and implemented Table Official courses to try and give anyone in our community the opportunity to learn how to do this critical aspect of our game
- We've continued our commitment to improving communication and continually strive to present information to members via both the website and Facebook, along with our usual emails. The appointment of a Media Manager intern in late 2011 should assist us in improving our communication to members even further, as well as gaining better coverage for our sport in the wider community.
- Governance has continued to improve, with the Board having a full year as it tries to ensure the association is built on a sound

financial basis, has strong and achievable strategies and good processes to implement them. Critical outcomes of the Board's work in the last year includes:

- Completion of a new Constitution to present to members in September 2011
- Completion of a new 4-year Strategic Plan, which is accompanied by annual Operational Plans. This is a great step to not only setting direction for the next four years, but for the Board to continually monitor our progress towards achieving these goals
- Creation of a Marketing & Sponsorship plan to be implemented in the year 2011/12. The objective of the plan is to deliver a complete approach to branding and sponsorship. Our aim is to introduce sponsorship partners to our sport, and in turn help the sport to grow positively and sustainably
- Completion of a "Good Governance" project in partnership with vicsport. This has allowed us to formally review our governance structures, and gives us a pathway for ensuring we build our governance structures into the future. Better governance will ensure better management and oversight of our sport in Victoria both now and into the future
- Our financial processes remain strong through sound controls and process. Sound financial outcomes allow the Board to think strategically about our finances and plan better into the future. This remains a critical part of our operations
- Competitions management has been a focus in two ways:
 - With the forthcoming closure of Hawthorn Aquatic Centre for redevelopment we have needed to find a suitable alternative location to host our Sub Junior competition. We

have been fortunate to secure space with Oakleigh Recreation Centre, and this will allow us to continue our Sub Junior competition in it's current format

- Gaining feedback from all Clubs on our competitions with a view to improving them within the constraints that we currently live with. This feedback has been invaluable, and we have used it to make critical adjustments to our immediate competitions. Further progress is needed however, and will continue in the coming year
- We are also looking forward to the introduction of Ovens & Murray Men's and Women's SL1 teams to our competition in 2011 and 2012
- The organisation has been successful in achieving a grant from VicHealth for the next three years that is valued at \$347,000. The grant will help us focus on the participation of females in our sport at all levels, and we hope that this provides a good framework for achieving strong development that benefits us all
- We have continued our work under Sports Development grants to make Water Polo a sport that is accessible to a wide range of participants over a range of ages. The introduction of Flippa Ball™ programs by a number of clubs is a positive step, as is the introduction of Flippa Ball™ to "Active After Schools Programs"
- Victoria will be the location of the inaugural 2012 Pan Pacific Water Polo Championships. This will allow us to see the Men's and Women's teams from Australia, USA, Canada, Japan, China and New Zealand, and we look forward to bring international Water Polo to MSAC in an Olympic year
- Our involvement with schools Water Polo continues with the ongoing management of the AGSV / MHS Competition. We aim to further the introduction of Water Polo into schools in Victoria

Additionally there has been fantastic opportunities for celebration including:

- Victorian Tigers Men's team achieving Silver Medal in the National League in May
- Victorian Tigers Women's team achieving the Bronze Medal in the National League in May
- The Victorian Schoolboys Team achieving the Silver Medal at the National Schools Championships in front of a home-town crowd in Melbourne in June
- The Victorian 18's Men's Team achieving the Bronze Medal at the National Championships in Brisbane in April
- Ted Donovan being a finalist in the 2010 VicHealth Lindsay Gaze Sporting Conduct Award. The award was one of many awards given by vicsport at their Victorian Sporting Awards night

Congratulations and thanks go to all participants in our Victorian representative squads and Australian representative squads

As Executive Officer I'd like to pass on my thanks to not only our team of paid staff – Julie Makohon, Tony Ryan and Carmen Stocks – but also all of you who volunteer your valuable time to making our competitions run and allow our various teams to train and travel, and also who look for opportunities to keep us improving. Thank you all for your contributions, all of which make our community such a great one to be part of.

I'd like to pass my thanks to Annabel Sides who has elected to not nominate for the Board in 2011/12. Annabel has been a passionate and committed contributor to the association for many years, and her input has been invaluable. I'm sure you all join me in thanking her for that contribution, and wish her all the best as she focuses on other aspects of her life.

Finally, my thanks to the VWPI Board for their support of a grant that I was fortunate enough to receive from the Australian Sports Commission. The grant has allowed me to complete the "Company Directors Course" offered by the Australian Institute of Company Directors. This is a highly regarded course

which gives participants a framework in which to improve the governance of an organisation. I've found the course to be of great benefit, and hope to bring the positive lessons gained from it to my role with VWPI. Without the grant I would have not had the opportunity to undertake the course, so my thanks to all the Board for their support and encouragement.

SPORTS DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Victorian Water Polo has been fortunate to receive funding from both VicHealth and the Department of Planning & Community Development – Sports & Recreation Victoria. The funding has been granted to allow us to develop water polo in Victoria, in defined projects that have been agreed between the funding bodies and ourselves.

Julie Makohon has continued to build a strong base for Water Polo in Victoria in her role as Sports Development Officer. She has now been in this role for just under three years, so has had the opportunity to continue building on a range of developments to benefit our sport including:

- Continued running of Flippa Ball™ programs in a variety of settings including Aquatic Centres, Schools (Primary & Secondary) and Universities. A critical path to success with this work is the assistance of clubs to deliver the programs, using members who are suitably qualified. We thank all those who have been involved in this process, because they are helping to build a critical part of our entry pathway to the sport
- To support and strengthen Water Polo development, a number of Swimming coaches have been trained in basic Water Polo techniques to allow the introduction of Water Polo to programs held under the Australian Sports Commission's Active After-School Communities (AASC) banner
- As an ongoing part of our grant obligations with VicHealth, Water Polo programs have been introduced to a range of groups who are often disadvantaged in and disconnected from our community, including the Deaf and Newly Arrived Immigrants and Women from communities who have limited involvement with

mainstream sports. We look forward to creating many opportunities that will provide these communities with the chance to be introduced to our sport, eventually becoming involved in our Clubs.

- We are addressing a major gap in our Flippa Ball™ resources by creating a series of activity cards that can be used by Club Coaches, Swimming Coaches and School teachers to introduce Flippa Ball™ to a far broader community. It will make Flippa Ball™ far more accessible and available, and can become far more effective as a development pathway
- Communication with Clubs is an area which we seek continuous improvement, and we use both our Webpage and Facebook to provide as much information as possible to our community, and also to allow us to engage with a wider community. We believe that this strategy is stimulating far greater queries about our sport, which we provide to clubs to assist their recruitment
- The strategic planning undertaken by the VWPI Board's Marketing & Sponsorship Sub Committee has been very positive, and when implemented in the coming year will allow us to introduce far greater improvement in the areas of website infrastructure, style, communication as well as building positive partnerships for sponsorship
- Marketing of our sport. Julie has continued to focus on advertising Water Polo in a fresh, fun and power manner to increase sport awareness. More general Water Polo advertising has come out this year to ensure the sport is always promoted, always in sight and always entertaining viewers.

Through initial advertising efforts, people learn that that we exist. With repeated exposure, they'll learn that we are stable. With even more repeated exposure, they'll assume we're successful and wish to become part of our sport – our focus is to sustain long-term advertising and excite people about becoming involved.

As was noted last year, a full time SDO provides great benefits to our sport as we endeavour to grow and develop, and we look forward to delivering the benefits of that role to you throughout the coming year.

Clubs & Membership

Membership increased marginally over the last year (1374→1421).

Whilst numbers dropped away at a few clubs, other metropolitan and country clubs continued to grow their membership through their junior ranks reflecting the value of work done in those areas.

This upward trend while pleasing must remain the focus of all clubs and the Association with an ongoing strong emphasis on growth through more junior programs particularly Flippa Ball™.

Our venture into new venues over the next 12 months will present clubs with the opportunity to strengthen and expand development initiatives and to expose our sport to new communities.

Clubs are encouraged to make use of the resources and support the VWPI office can provide.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

It has been another busy year for the board which has required us to debate a variety of issues and challenges which will shape the future of our governance structures and the longer term strategic direction of the Association. I'm delighted that we have collectively achieved a number of successes over the year and I take this opportunity to thank all of the Board for their contribution and professionalism and all of our staff for their continued dedication.

This year our Executive Officer's employment contract expired in June and the Board was delighted to secure an extension to Gillian Manson's contract until June 2012. Gillian's contribution to VWPI has been outstanding and we look forward to continuing to work with Gillian in the year ahead.

Over the course of the year the Board spent a considerable amount of time developing a four year strategic plan for the Association. This plan sets down a number of measurable key performance indicators which will assist the Association monitor its strategic objectives across Operations, Management & Governance, Sports Development and High Performance. A major part of the plan includes the carrying out of a thorough risk assessment review of the Association. It is our intention to have the first part of this exercise completed in the first half of the new financial year. The strategic plan was signed off by the Board in June and came into effect on 1st July this year. It has been circulated to all of our clubs and can now be viewed on the Association's website.

During the year the Association was fortunate to secure the services of Ian Clarke of Precedent Management who conducted a thorough governance review of the Association which also comprised a Board Review. Ian has a substantial track record in such matters in the sports industry and made a number of recommendations which the Board will continue to work on as it seeks to achieve the objectives of the four year strategic plan. One of the recommendations was to seek more diversity on our Board. The Board is extremely keen to increase female participation on the Board, either from current/former participants in our sport and/or from experienced business leaders within the

sports business. The Board is also keen to seek the representation from our country community.

Over the past 18 months the Board has been reviewing the Association's constitution. The Board would like to thank Darren McClafferty, John Howie and Bryan Wee, all of whom have provided extremely valuable input into the drafting and review of the new constitution which will be presented to our stakeholders for approval at the AGM in September.

Following the Association's successful application this year to Vic Health for additional funding (\$347,000 over the next three years) the Association will be increasing its investment into increasing female participation in the sport and improving our governance procedures. VWPI will need to increase its staffing and reconfigure its offices accordingly and our EO is busy planning accordingly. This additional funding undoubtedly provides VWPI with a unique opportunity to drive the sport forward and to strengthen the Association's core infrastructure for the benefit of all in our community. The successful outcome of our application to Vic Health would not have been achieved without the efforts of our EO, the staff and the Board, particularly in their combined efforts surrounding the four year strategic plan.

The successes of the past year leave our Association well placed to enhance our governance procedures and to achieve the goals set out in our strategic plan. Once again I extend my thanks to all on the Board, all our staff and all the volunteers who bring so much to the sport. We look forward to working with you all in the year ahead.

COMPETITIONS REPORT

Events

Victoria hosted two events over the last year - the 20U National Championships in July 2010 and the Australian Schools Championships in May 2011. Both events were highly rated successes in terms of both staging and results. VWPI was also scheduled to host the 2011 East Coast Challenge in July but, with the 16U National Club Championships scheduled for Melbourne in Sept-Oct, "gave up" this event to Qld. The 16s Club Championships will be the largest event VWPI has staged with 48 teams and over 700 competitors expected, and 4 pools across 3 separate venues to be used. The tournament will present many logistical challenges in managing our equipment and volunteer resources.

As has been said many times in the past, it would not be possible to stage these events without assistance from our community of water polo volunteers here in Victoria and VWPI is confident they will rise to the occasion once again.

Victorian teams finished with medals at 4 National Age Championships through 2010-2011. The Boys went down to NSW at both the 20/U National Championships (7-9) and the Aust Schools Championships (6-11) in front of large home-town crowds at MSAC while the Boys took Bronze with a 9-4 win

over QLD Maroon at the 18/U Championships in Brisbane. Melbourne Collegians Boys also won Bronze at the 16/U Clubs Championships in Hobart. Victorian Girls teams weren't able to bring home any medals but ended with very credible 4th placings at the Australian Schools Championships in Melbourne and the East Coast Challenge in Brisbane.

2010 State Championships

The 2010 State Championships once again saw an increased number of teams with 48 Men's and 25 Women's competing in 12

grades. Games were again played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at MSAC and on Tuesday and Thursday nights at Melbourne High School.

MC Titans were premiers in the Men's State League 1 competition with Footscray winning the Women's. The Melbourne Collegians club took 6 of the 7 Men's and 3 of the Women's premierships and were no doubt the dominant club of the competition. It was disappointing that one Grand Final ended with a disqualification but VWPI Bylaws are quite specific regarding player eligibility for finals and will continue to be enforced.

2011 Winter Competition

The 2011 Winter Competition saw a drop in the number of teams with 47 Men's and 23 Women's teams competing. Again games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both MSAC and on Wednesday and Thursday nights at Melbourne High School.

Footscray won both the Men's and Women's State League 1 premierships and Melbourne Collegians again lead the way with 4 Men's and 2 Women's premierships. Ringwood Buccaneers broke the club's long time premiership drought with a win in Men's State League 5.

Congratulations to all grade premiers and individual award winners over both competition series. Results for all grade competitions and awards are listed later in this report.

2010 Sub-Junior competition

Teams in the Sub-Junior competition jumped to 21 with 7 12/U Mixed teams, 9 14/U Boys and 5 14/U Girls teams competing. The games were played on Sunday mornings and afternoons at Hawthorn Aquatic Centre with lots of enthusiasm and fun, and plenty of vocal support.

Growth of water polo in Victoria will come from within these ranks so development programs at this level are essential. Clubs are encouraged to implement junior development programs and the VWPI office can offer assistance in getting such programs up and running.

Thanks to Matt Wallace-Smith who acted as Pool Controller for the Sub-Junior competition and to all our younger developing referees for their time and efforts, and to the families who assisted with the running of this competition.

2011 Junior Club Championships

The inaugural Victorian Junior Club Championships were held in Albury Wodonga from 25-27 February 2011 and was hosted by the Albury and Wodonga clubs. The objective was to bring teams of 14 and 16 year-olds from around Victoria to play each other, and to have more contact and development opportunities for our Metropolitan and Regional-based clubs and athletes. A total of 24 teams competed in the two age-groups and it was great to see good quality water polo from these younger players. VWPI hopes to replicate this event in the years ahead. Results are listed later in this report.

Referees and Officials

A number of initiatives were launched over the year to increase the number of available and quality of our referees. A Referees Commission was established and an assessment process introduced with all referees to be assessed at least once during each season. While it obviously takes time to gain experience and to develop our resources, we are moving forward. However VWPI recognises that consistency in referee decision-making is a major issue and is planning to conduct regular education/training forums involving referees, coaches and players.

Several courses were also held through the year for Table Officials aimed at increasing the number and improving the understanding of available volunteers for these tasks at both our domestic and National competitions.

Pool Space

Pool space continues to be an ongoing challenge particularly with the imminent two year closure of Hawthorn Aquatic Centre for redevelopment. The Board and the VWPI office will continue to have discussions with Councils, school and other pool venues with the aim of spreading our competition and training load. VWPI has successfully gained access to 3 new venues - Oakleigh Recreation Centre, Monash Aquatic & Recreation Centre and the soon to be

opened Glen Eira Sports and Aquatic Centre - and competition and training activities will commence at each of these in late 2011.

Acknowledgments

The Board acknowledges the cooperation and work of MSAC management and Aquatics staff who have again been very helpful in meeting our pool requirements. Because our demands often conflict with other aquatic sports, VWPI now developed a successful working relationship with Diving Victoria and Swimming Victoria whereby all parties share their proposed event calendars prior to discussions with MSAC.

Thanks also to the management and staff at Hawthorn Recreation Centre and South Yarra Sports Centre for their continued support of our competitions and training needs.

We must also acknowledge the cooperation of our pool of hard-working referees - we really do call on them a lot each week - and to the work done by our Pool Controllers Alby Morrison and Stephen Wight at MSAC and Rob Gronow and Frank Mielke at Melbourne High School. And finally, a thank you again to everyone who volunteered during VWPI's regular season competitions and national events as table officials, goal judges, computer operators, referees, pool set-up/pack-up etc - tasks that are essential to the success of all our competitions.

The Referees Commission has now been established and has been productive in assisting and grading referees. The Commission comprises of Daniel Flahive, Mike DeFina, Michael McNeil, John Mason and Alby Morrison. These people need to be thanked for giving their time in addition to normal ref duties to help with the grading of referees.

During the past year there were 2 x level 1 Ref courses held. Michael McNeill and Michael DeFina ran a course in Melbourne with 23 participants and Alby Morrison ran a course in Wodonga also with 23 participants. Think this is a great result for a start, however the more people accredited the better our refing will become.

We've enhanced the Level 1 training of Referees course by introducing a series of DVD clubs that are used to teach decision making in real game situations for new Referees. This was put together by Michael DeFina and VWPI paid for the production of the DVD.

We have created a new Referee assessment tool which has been used for Referees to be assessed and mentored, and to assist us in ensuring we have Referees graded effectively.

Congratulations to our National League Referees who gain more experience at National League level to bring back to our State Competition. Those were Daniel Flahive, Alby Morrison, John Mason, Steve Wight, Brad Griffiths, David Smyth and Garry Rydberg. Also, delegates Michael McNeill and Michael DeFina.

A number of referees improved their level over the past 12 months. This shows the contribution and commitment of referees is improving.

Thanks to the VWPI Board and staff for their support and help in all areas of referees needs.

Finally, thanks to Tony Ryan for his tireless efforts once again for arranging and organising referees for every game of our competition. A job always well done!

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

In the 2010/11 VWPI had a very successful year with its development activities building on the good foundations of the previous year. Our two major achievements have been having a fully funded development officer for a third year and the continued success of the Tiered structure for athlete development aligning with our status as a Tier 1 sport with the Victorian Institute of Sport (VIS).

Julie Makohon has continued in the role of a full time Sport Development Officer and her report for the year is attached.

The VIS Coach Dalibor Maslan has lead the Tier program which has enhanced the skills of the junior development squads in Victoria. Both boys and girls squads have three levels, train regularly and we have seen major improvements. This has also lead to part time roles for up to 7 coaches as well as Dalibor. Victoria has been represented at all national levels which is a recognition of the hard work of the athletes, their support networks and the coaches. With the increase in activity and participation, there has been pressure on pool access which had lead to some challenges for the VWPI staff. All which has been positively resolved. The highlight of the program was when a boys group was able to go and train in Montenegro. Hopefully this will become a regular part of the program and in 2012 we can get a girls team away to an international destination.

The challenge for the future is to consolidate on this good work and for it to follow through the established pathways back to clubs in the forms of better coaching development and the skills of the Tier programs athletes enthusing and challenging other club members to higher levels in our sport.

Club juniors development is a vital part of the health of water polo in our state especially

with National under 18's being added to the National under 14s and under 16s as club based competitions in 2012. Now that we have the VIS and underpinning program in place and promotion of our sport coming from our Sport Development Officer, VWPI is looking to assist any clubs with junior development going forward. Some clubs do an excellent job already but if we can assist other clubs, then VWPI is happy to provide any assistance we can.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Financial Year 2010/11 was a period of further consolidation of a number of changes the board introduced in the 2009/10 financial year. These changes outlined in the last Annual Report have proved critical in providing strong management of association finances. Our goal was to not only have sound management practices, but to also create a budget process that allows us to strategically plan for our future in both income sourcing and expense management.

In addition there have been a number of further changes that have enhanced the system and procedures. These include:

- Enhanced budgeting procedures to allow far more rigorous focus on the actual cost of our operations, and from there strategically planning forward
- The Registration process will be moved to an on-line format to help reduce club administration load and improve cash flow for all parties involved (Clubs, VWPI and AWPI)
- Further simplification of our chart of accounts. Through operation we have been able to make the chart simpler and clearer, allowing far better understanding and monitoring of the accounts by the Board and staff
- The introduction of the Athlete Development Program has been a major undertaking, but the process has now settled in well
- For the first time we organised an overseas tour for our Athlete Development program athletes. The work involved was rewarded, and we look forward to creating more and similar opportunities for our athletes in these programs moving forward

The year in summary

The accounts show a loss incurred for the 2010/11 year of \$4860.56. This is less than the budgeted loss. This year we have started accruing for Annual Leave of our staff, written off all stock. We currently hold no stock.

Of note, we have accrued \$13,500 as a prepayment into FY 2011/12. This is a grant from the Department of Sport and Recreation to assist us in running the 16's National Club Championships. The grant was received in the FY 2010/11, but we've elected to accrue the funds into FY2011/12 so that it can be expensed within the same financial as it was accrued.

Looking ahead - Financial Year 2011 / 12

VWPI currently anticipates annual income of approximately \$597,000, annual expenditure of approximately \$596,000, and retains cash reserves of just over \$250,000. We are budgeting to breakeven this year

At present, VWPI has several main sources of income:

- Registration / Competition fees received from Members
- Grants received from funding bodies including:
 - Victorian Government's Department of Sport & Recreation
 - VicHealth
- Income from athletes participating in VWPI-provided development programs

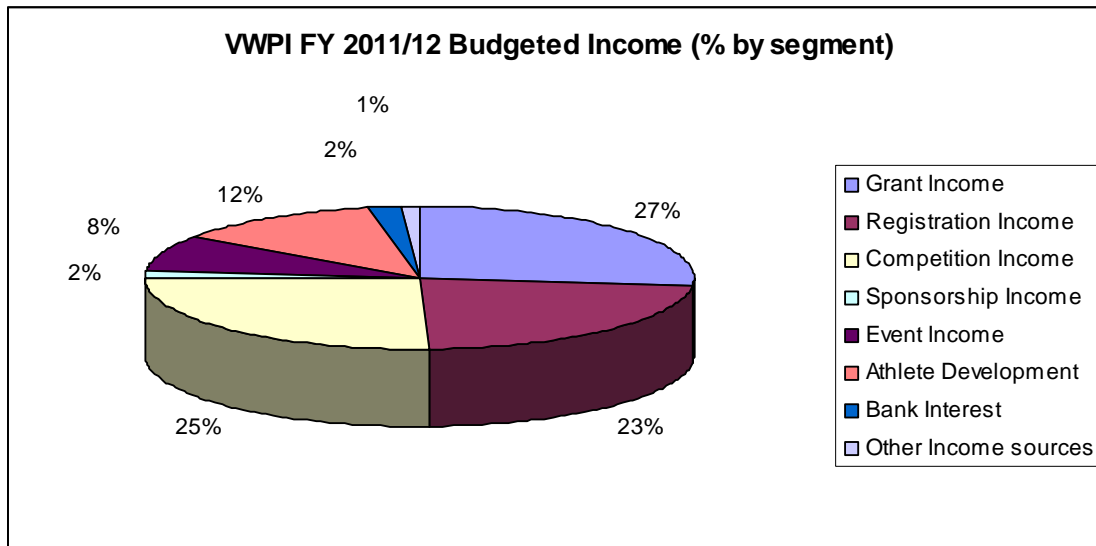
The VWPI Board is seeking to broaden the association's income base with the achievement of ongoing, sustainable sponsorship income, as well as looking to create a recreational arm to our sport in Victoria.

Grant funding is critical to the operation of association, and, the majority of the grant funding currently received (90%) is tied to us achieving specific outcomes as agreed with the funding body. i.e., it cannot be transferred for other uses within the association. We submit grant applications that are in alignment with our strategic objectives, and which are focussed around development of the sport in specific areas. Our funding from VicHealth for the next three years that will allow us to focus on development in the area of female participation, and our current funding from the Victorian Government's Department of Sport and Recreation allows us to focus on developing resources for junior development, schools Water Polo development as well as our capacity in the areas of Coaching and Refereeing.

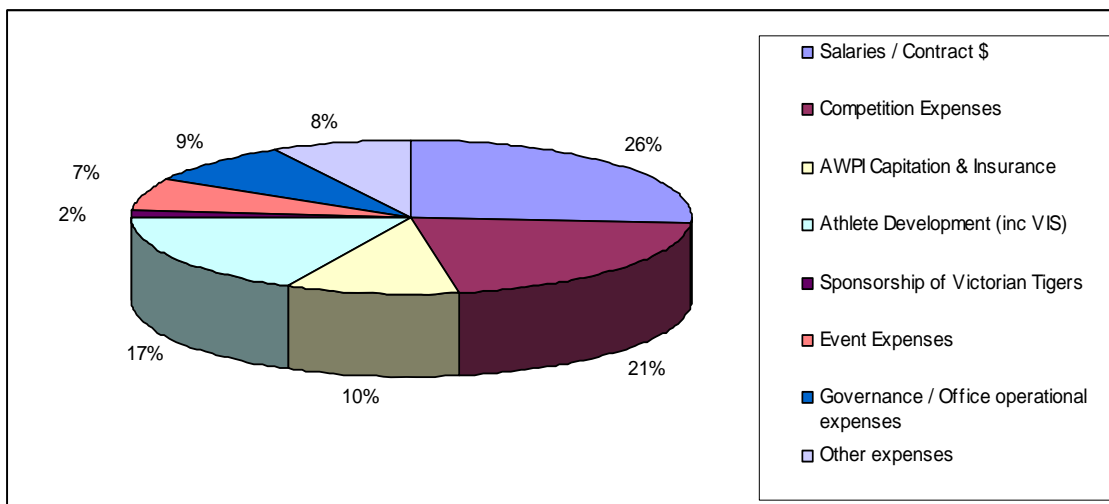
In the pie graphs below, we show two key elements of our Budget for the coming year:
