PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to present the 2015/16 Annual Report of our Association - Water Polo Victoria (WPV).

WPV has had another marvellous year although not without its challenges. I would like to sincerely thank the Board and the staff this year for its support and for ensuring that WPV and the competition are managed in a professional manner. Special thanks to Simon Blundell who contributed two years to the leadership and management of the sport. The Board has appointed Sally Jones to the role of EO.

I also want to thank the backbone and unsung heroes of our community including:

- competition co-ordinators, pool controllers, referees, coaches, managers and officials who put in such an enormous amount of work to making our sport the success it is
- the office staff – lead by Simon Blundell and Sally Jones, Tom Madden, Tony Ryan, Michael Defina and Deb Vawdrey for their ongoing hard work in the running and development of the sport
- Board members who spent a great deal of their personal time working to improve what we do and to the best we can
- the MSAC staff for the support they provide to WPV
- staff at the VIS, including the program head coach Dalibor Maslan, assistant coach Sloba Macic and program manager Dave Crosbee for their ongoing support of our high performance athletes
- tiered program coaches who support the pathway program for promising athletes
- WPA staff and board for their support
- funding bodies VicHealth and Sport & Recreation Victoria & the contract managers who support the WPV staff in their work
- and, of course, all the players who have enjoyed the competition during the year, be it at their first attempt at the sport or as a seasoned veteran.

Congratulations to those members selected as State, National and Australian representatives, either as players or officials. In this Olympic year we were represented in Rio by Rowie Webster, James Stanton-French, Jarrod Gilchrist, Daniel Flahive, Lynne Morrison and Dalibor Maslan.

The Victorian Seals program had a stunning year, showing real leadership in sport in the areas of diversity and inclusion and in support of community programs such as beyondblue, Step Back Think and the VOC. The Victorian Seals hosted the Pride Cup in support of the LGBTIQ community. Water Polo is seen as a leader in Pride in Sport. The National League finals were held in Melbourne, supported by the Victorian Government. The Seal's men's team received the silver medal after going down to the UWA torpedoes in a penalty shootout. The Seal's women's team made the finals and placed 5th. The program is a real community asset.

The Board and office has spent a long time working with the WPA, the VIS and the Seals to develop a new inclusive high performance platform for the post Rio period and the new four cycle leading up to Tokyo. We expect that this program will take the learnings of the first four-year program and strengthen the water polo community in Victoria.

The Board this year has established its next five-year strategic plan (2016 to 2020). The focus will be to "Secure the future of the Sport of Water Polo in the state of Victoria through a balanced focus on participation for fun and pathways for performance". Its four key pillars will focus on: Participation, Image, Governance in the Sport and Supporting High Performance. We will be working closely with clubs on this strategic direction.

WPV is funded from three sources. Firstly, funds come from players via members' registrations and match fees. The Board recognises that we are here to organise and run the best competition we can. Second, a small but growing stream comes from sponsors. We appreciate the role played by our sponsors and I encourage the community to support those who support us. Finally, government grants were received from VicHealth and Sport and Recreation Victoria that contribute to organisational development and water polo opportunities and programs. VicHealth funding focuses on increasing participation through socially focused programs such as bumpa ball and the women's program and we can report positive feedback and major progress on this grant's objectives.

It was pleasing to see the continued growth of numbers in the U14 and U12 players participating this year. The growth of this age group is critical to future sustainability of water polo in Victoria. This year, the standard at the ECC competition in Melbourne was the best in years and our sub-junior program is becoming more popular, utilising Hawthorn, Greensborough, Ringwood and Melbourne High pools. WPV is looking to support clubs in extending and growing their junior program. The effort of some clubs in regional and metropolitan areas is highly commendable, and we will see this effort rewarded in time.

There has been a full contingent on the board for the past couple of years, achieving a diverse board membership of youth, experience, skills and passion. I thank the Board for their contribution.

Junior development is an essential pillar of our future growth, and sport management students from Deakin University have been working with our clubs to develop more detailed junior development plans. Our competitions committee, headed by Darren Waters, has also been meeting regularly to examine how our competitions calendar can be restructured to enable greater participation and a continued high standard of water polo. This strategic planning for the future, and working with the WPV community to implement the actions associated with this plan, will continue to be a priority for the Board as we move into 2017.

We are fortunate to have an extremely committed board of directors at WPV, and I would like to thank the Executive – John Perrott, Ben Yeo and Genevieve Venosta – for their work and assistance this year. I would also like to acknowledge and thank the volunteers within WPV and our various clubs, who dedicate numerous hours each week to ensuring our competitions run smoothly- they are critical to the success of our sport.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

Having only recently commenced with WPV, I am pleased to report on a very exciting & progressive year for our sport in Victoria:

- At the local level the annual competitions, state championships, sub-junior, and winter competitions have been conducted. Congratulations to the successful teams. The Victorian Junior State Championships were again successfully hosted by the Geelong Marlins, and included live streaming the finals. If we throw National League into the mix, I believe there were only about five weeks of the year where there was not some form of water polo taking place in Victoria, which is an incredible achievement.
- At the representative level, we had men's and women's teams attended the National U18s competition in Perth. Three teams (two boys and one girls) battled it out in a home tournament with other states at the East Coast Challenge, and we sent an U16 boys' team to the Pan Pacs in NZ. All teams did Victoria proud. We hope to be able to continue to send Victorian teams away to more competitions together as the pathway program continues to evolve.
- On the sport development front, we held social women's competitions - Summer Splash, Polo by the Pier, Flippa Ball sessions - and launched a pilot program for Bumpa Ball, or inner tube water polo, with the assistance of funding from VicHealth, Sport and Recreation Victoria and VicSport. We continued to work with APS, AGSV and GSV sporting associations to better engage with their water polo programmes. A Gala Day was also held in conjunction with School Sport Victoria with a view to rolling out a sporting schools program and thereby expose and attract more school-aged children into water polo.
- WPV and the Victorian Seals also hosted the NWPL beyondblue Cup and, with support from the Victorian Government, the 2016 NWPL Finals. The biggest and most colourful event of the year was the Pride Cup where water polo, and in particular the Victorian Seals led the way in saying no to discrimination in sport, and yes to diversity.

In reviewing what has taken place in Victorian water polo over the past twelve months, I am thoroughly impressed. Accordingly, I would like to acknowledge and thank the Board, Simon Blundell and Tom Madden for generating such a high level of quality opportunities for the water polo community.

EVENTS

Water Polo Victoria hosted two national events at MSAC in 2016

- March: 2016 National League Finals
- July: 2016 East Coast Challenge

It had been 25 years since the NWPL finals were last staged in Melbourne. Both events were an outstanding success proving once again MSAC is a highly-rated venue for water polo, and that WPV brings great organisational expertise to such events.

INTERNATIONAL

A number of Victorian representative players and officials again gained international competition experience over the last year. The most significant recognition was selection in the National team for the Rio Olympics. Congratulations to:

- James Stanton-French & Rowie Webster & to Dalibor Maslan (Asst Womens Coach) & Lynne Morrison (Women's Team Manager)
- Daniel Flahive toured far and wide as referee with senior National teams and was once again rewarded with selection.

Other Victorians to tour internationally or play international matches on home soil with the Aussie Senior Men and Women were Scott Carpenter, Blake Edwards, Lachlan Edwards, Matt Gronow and Maddie Steere. Younger players who gained international experience or who have been selected were Angus Campbell, Cameron Gilmour, Mitch Hallam, Nick Hallam, Cade Logan, Harry Molnar, Will Paynter, Jackson Summers and Zoe Hille.

Congratulations to all players and officials on their selection and results – great achievements.

NATIONAL

2016 National League

In leading up to the National teams Rio Olympics preparation, the 2016 NWPL season was rescheduled to start in November 2015 and play over the summer months leading to the finals series in Melbourne in March.

The Men's team had another outstanding season, falling just short in the gold medal final to UWA Torpedoes 11-13 in a tense penalty shoot-out. The Seals Women made the finals only to be knocked out in their elimination final before improving their final standing with a solid 17-8 win over UWA Torpedoes. The Seals management team again partnered with the beyondblue Foundation to stage the beyondblue Cup and with the Victorian Olympic Committee to stage The Spirit of the Olympics night both events held at MSAC.

And in another major initiative, the Seals partnered with WPV's own LGBTIQ water polo club, Melbourne Surge, to launch the inaugural Pride Cup which will become an annual event as part of the Midsumma calendar. The Pride Cup involving NWPL teams recognises the journey to achieve diversity and inclusion in water polo and received great support from the Victorian Government, the Victorian Aids Council and LGBTIQ community.

2016 East Coast Challenge

Eight boys and seven girls teams from VIC, NSW, QLD, SA and TAS competed over 4 days in this 14/Under tournament supported by a large and vocal crowd of team and family support.

VICTORIAN

2015 State Championships

The 2015 State Championships saw 52 male and 25 female teams competing in 13 grades including an Ovens and Murray Women's team in State League 1.

Youth Boys (16/U) was divided into A and B grades and again due to lack of entries, there was no Junior Women's (18/U) competition. The JnrW teams played in WSL2 through the season before playing a separate finals series.

Venues were MSAC and Melbourne High School with games played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both venues with Ovens & Murray games being played on Saturdays at MSAC, Watermarc and in Wodonga. State League 1 Men's games were also played at MSAC, Watermarc and the new Aquanation pool in Ringwood.

Six clubs shared the 14 premierships with 2 decided by penalty shootouts and 1 by 'golden goal'. Footscray and NYP Dragons took the pennants in Men's and Women's SL1 with Dragons winning all 3 Senior Women's grades. Melbourne Collegians and NYP Dragons were the most successful clubs with 4 premierships each.

2016 Winter Competition

A record number of teams competed in the 2016 Winter Competition season - 53 male and 29 female – including two new clubs, Old Ivanhoe Vikings and Peninsula Flyers.

Again there were 13 grades with A and B for Youth Boys and Junior Womens playing in WSL2 then a separate finals series. Games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both MSAC and Melbourne High School with Ovens & Murray games played on Sunday afternoons at Watermarc in Greensborough. Nine clubs made the Grand Finals with wins shared across seven - Melbourne Collegians (4), La Trobe University, NYP Dragons and Richmond (2), Essendon, Melbourne University and Monash University (1). Again due to scheduling difficulties involving Ovens & Murray games, the Womens SL1 final has not yet been played.

Congratulations to all grade premiers - results for all grade competitions are listed later in this report.

Tribunal Reports

With 15 Referee Reports during the 2015 State Championships and 11 during the 2016 Winter Competition and a number of related issues also arising during this period, the WPV Board has recently completed a review and redraft of the current Judiciary Policy. Apart from a number of procedural changes, the new version will see increased penalty sanctions and season “carry-overs”. The new policy is expected to be released in the near future.

2015-2016 Sub-Junior Competition

This season’s games were played across 4 venues – mostly at Hawthorn and Melbourne High School with a few rounds at Watermarc and the new double-pool setup at Aquanation. The 12/U Mixed teams again played in the shallow end at Hawthorn and following a decision by the WPV Board, there was no competition ladder or any finals playoffs for this grade.

Teams increased to 23 (up 3 from 2014/15) - 9 in 12/U Mixed, 5 14/U Girls and 9 14/U Boys (4 A grade, 5 B grade). Teams played ‘double header’ games on alternate weeks at Hawthorn and every week at Melbourne High which once again was a successful format.

Medals were spread around all clubs in the 14/U grades & all 12/U players were presented with small participation pennants. WPV thanks everyone in the Sub-Junior community for their help with table duties, etc. and their attendance support at each venue. Thanks also to all our younger developing referees for their time and effort ,and to those senior referees who took on the mentoring role.

2016 Junior Club Championships

The Victorian Junior Club Championships were again held in Geelong at the Kardina Aquatic Centre over a February weekend. Team entries were received from 11 clubs made up of 14 from Melbourne, 12 Regional and 4 Interstate teams – over 320 players in total. There were 5 competition grades being 12/U Mixed, 14/U and 16/U Boys and Girls.

The Geelong Marlins team led by Julie and John O’Callaghan and their club volunteers did a great job in the pre-event organising and the huge task through the weekend with pool setup and pack up each day, match check-in and scorebook handling, results collation, etc. Congratulations to John and Julie and to the club in again making the tournament such a success.

The medal games on Sunday were again ‘live streamed’ by My Sport Live providing the opportunity for families and friends back in Melbourne, Albury-Wodonga and Hobart the chance to see the kids in action. Thanks to all players and coaches for their enthusiasm and cooperation through the weekend. And congratulations to those teams and individuals who won the medals and individual awards.

Acknowledgments

Despite a number of new pools being opened in the last two years, acquiring the pool space required to stage all our competitions is a never-ending challenge.

WPV acknowledges the cooperation and efforts of management and aquatics staff at MSAC, Melbourne High School, Hawthorn Aquatic Centre, Watermarc in Greensborough, Aquanation in Ringwood and Kardinia Aquatic in Geelong in working with us to meet our needs for both competition and training – relationships we value highly.

WPV also acknowledges and thanks the commitment and work of Michael DeFina and David Smyth who have taken on the difficult and time-consuming task of referee rostering over the last year. It continues to reflect that the many that have done/ still do play in our higher grades are not willing to give back some time to our sport.

Once again thanks to our dedicated band of pool controllers and regular referees who support our competitions week in, week out. We call on them time and again to cover all games with two referees – something not always achievable.

REFEREE'S REPORT

From the outset I would like to thank everyone who has volunteered their time this year to referee, whether they have refereed one game or one hundred, without you we wouldn't be able to enjoy our regular competitions. Overall the 2015/16 year was a solid one for the refereeing community. The ongoing challenges we face continued with the thankless task of balancing consistency with introducing new referees to the competition being a constant focus.

This year saw a changing of the guard with Mike DeFina stepping back after many years of tireless service to the community. I am happy to say that we had quite a few people step in to fill the void. A special thanks here to Alby Morrison, John Mason, Alon Pfau and David Smyth.

We have seen the behaviours of referees changing to match our 'Think. Act. Play.' mantra with referees following through with reports to try to tackle the heaviness and lack of respect we have seen in past. The recent winter competition saw 11 reports vs 3 and 9 in 2015 and 2014 respectively. This is a journey and although we are not perfect, we are definitely getting better. Mistakes will always be made, but we are trying our best. We look to the playing community to continue to support 'Think. Act. Play.' and respect our volunteer referees.

Some initiatives that have been/are being introduced this season centre around continuing to drive consistency:

- 'Top 5' themes - we have been circulating some key focus areas for referees including some technical aspects and reducing heaviness
- Super delegates - give real time feedback to referees with the view to driving 'fair play', the right behaviours and consistency (thanks to Mike DeFina and Michael McNeil for their efforts here)
- Improved grading of referees - bringing our processes into line with national standards & more actively reviewing performance
- International experience - we do have one of the top international referees in our midst with Daniel Flahive again being recognised at the elite level with regular international postings, culminating in being one of the top ranked referees at the Rio Olympics. We need to cascade this experience and that of the other senior referees down to all levels of the refereeing community.
- We also have seen some good growth in regular referees, welcoming another 10-15 new refs to the ranks.
- We also continue to support the numerous school and national competitions held in Victoria with Rowan Bennett, Mike DeFina, David Smyth, Tony Ryan and the office ensuring these run smoothly.

So thanks again to all our brave volunteers this year and we look forward to continuing to work in partnership with the players to provide an enjoyable environment for all.

STATE DEVELOPMENT REPORT

How quickly time passes in the non-stop, action-packed water polo world! A number of initiatives have been created and supported over the past 12 months. I would like to thank everyone who has played a part in the development and operations/delivery of these opportunities as without your assistance, they simply wouldn't have taken place. Some of the highlights for me have been:

- Introduction of School Sport Victoria (SSV) Gala Day for water polo – held at Melbourne High School, four girls and four boys' teams participated, which saw water polo return to SSV. All schools and their students had a fantastic time and this event will form the basis of continued discussions with SSV.
- GSV/APS Representative matches for senior students – held at MSAC at the end of 2015, teams were selected from the GSV and APS competitions to play against one another in a representative game between the two school sport associations. Both the boys' and girls' games were close matches, with fantastic gameplay and team sportsmanship shown by all participants, officials and spectators.
- Introduction of a weekly Social Women's program – held at Melbourne High School, this program provided an opportunity for females of all ages and abilities to participate in the sport in a social and encouraging environment. As a result of the program a full team was entered into the winter competition WSL3 division as part of one of our member clubs. Thank you to everyone who assisted with this program, with special mentions to Perri Randall, Mel Coffey and Clare O'Donnell.
- Hosting of the 2016 East Coast Challenge – Victoria entered two boys and one girls team into the event this year, with two of the three teams making it through to the Bronze medal games. Congratulations to all of the athletes on a fantastic achievement in 2016! I would also like to thank the coaches, managers and parents for their assistance in getting the teams prepared, supporting the Victorian representative pathway and ensuring everything ran smoothly throughout the event. A special mention to Stuart Deans, Michael Defina, Tony Ryan and Michael McNeill for their tireless work in ensuring all elements of the event ran smoothly.
- Creation of Flippa Ball at MSAC – encouraging the development of a regular program at MSAC which allowed participants between the ages of 8 and 14 an opportunity to learn introductory elements of the sport.

It would not make great reading for me to include everything that has taken place over the past 12 months; however I would like to list some of the other highlights for me from the past year:

- Polo by the Pier – once again run by Old Melburnians
- Return of Brighton Baths Fast 5's – thank you to Alli and Charlotte
- NWPL Games played in Wodonga as part of the Victorian Seals home fixture
- Hosting of the NWPL Finals in Melbourne
- Victorian Junior Club Championships – thank you to the Geelong Marlins
- Summer Splash – thank you Glen
- Continuing to work with the Ballarat Aquatic and Lifestyle Centre and City of Ballarat to create opportunities for participation in the sport locally.

The year has also seen the development of an important and exciting modified version of the sport called Bumpa Ball (inner tube water polo). Through partnering with VicHealth, we obtained funding to pilot and develop Bumpa Ball here in Victoria. The funding has allowed us to employ a Bumpa Ball Coordinator, enabled us to test the product in different market segments and engage with Victorians who would normally consider water polo as a sport they wouldn't feel comfortable participating in. The goal is to pull down all participation barriers which exist for traditional water polo and provide diverse communities with an opportunity to become more active.

Communication and engagement with the wider water polo community has continued to play an important part of ensuring our members are kept up to date with news developments and opportunities. Our Facebook, Twitter and Instagram pages have all seen an increase in not only likes and follows, but also in general interaction with the content being communicated. The WPV website has also had an increase in interaction and views, and continues to be our most popular method of providing information to our members and the broader community.

After working in the office for the past two years, I have accepted an opportunity in another area of the Victorian sporting sector and will be leaving WPV. I would like to thank the WPV Board, former Executive Officer (EO) Simon Blundell, current EO Sally Jones, the water polo community and all of the external stakeholders and organisations for your support, cooperation and friendship over the past two years. It has been a great experience working in the sport I am passionate about, and I look forward to seeing the sport continuing to develop and grow into the future.

FINANCIAL YEAR 2015-2016 IN REVIEW

The financial accounts for Water Polo Victoria, year-end 30 June 2016, are prepared on a cash basis, therefore, can be affected by the timing of receipts and payments, when compared to prior year comparatives.

The accounts show a total surplus for the financial year ended 30 June 2016 of \$69,616.

Due to the accounts being prepared on a cash basis the surplus has arisen due to timing difference where income has been received in FY16 and the expenses will be incurred in FY17.

We received a total of \$93,000 of grant income of which \$65,000 was from Vic Health and \$28,000 from Sport and Recreation Victoria. \$40,000 of this grant funding was received across May and June 2016. This resulted in a timing difference of approximately \$49,000 of income received in the FY16 financial year, which will be expensed in the FY17 financial year. This explains why we have a large surplus at the end of 30 June 2016. We also received income in June 2016 of \$50,221 for the East Coast Challenge tournament which was held in July, however, had only incurred corresponding expenses of \$24,831. While this competition does run at a breakeven the remaining \$25,000 of expenditure is to be incurred in FY17. This has further contributed to the surplus position at 30 June 2016.

Water Polo Victoria continues to support the Victorian Seals including \$10,000 sponsorship as well as \$16,000 to underwrite their operations for the 15/16 season.

While our position at 30 June 2016 appears to be very strong, we anticipate that this will correct in the coming financial year as grant funding received prior to the beginning of the financial year is acquitted. Due to our small staff base, the changes to grants have a significant impact. The focus of government grants continues to change from supporting organisations at large, to supporting specific projects, events and innovative programs. Our Sport and Recreation grant continues to the end of FY17. We expect to receive two instalments each of \$15,000 during the FY17 financial year. Our grant received from Vic Health in relation to Bumpa Ball has concluded and we are working with VicHealth to discuss upcoming applications which will be granted for proposals satisfying the criteria of 'innovation'.

We are aware that increasing fees is never a popular decision; however, our sport has been largely buoyed by government grants which continue to diminish in availability. The board continues to seek opportunities to fund our sport. We are evaluating how we can sustain our current office functions and withstand the increasing costs to run our sport including increasing pool hire costs. Our key sources of income are:

- registration and competition fees from members
- grants received from funding bodies.

A key funding initiative for FY17 is the Water Polo Victoria raffle. We are asking for the community's support in making this raffle a success. It will be important for our financial position going forward to be innovative to continue to generate funds in an increasingly competitive climate.

Our debtor position was \$121,487 at the end of June, of which \$4,886 or 4% was 90 days and over. The majority of this balance (71%) sits in current, within 30 days. The timing of the East Coast challenge held soon after year end contributed to our debtors' balance, however, the long overdue amounts remain minimal.

I would like to thank our bookkeeper, Deb Vawdrey from Southern Bookworks and our auditor Ravi Mutyala for conducting the audit this year. I would also like to thank Simon Blundell, our previous EO for working diligently to leave a strong financial position as well as his work on bringing our debtors under control. I would also like to thank Sally Jones, incoming EO for her commitment to continuing the legacy of sound financial management.



Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 June 2016

a. Income Tax

The entity is exempt from Income Tax.

b. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

e. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f. Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

g. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

h. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

i. Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

j. If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

k. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

l. Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Therefore there were no satisfactory audit procedures that we could perform to obtain reasonable assurance that all receipts were properly recorded. The scope of the audit has been limited to the income recorded in the accounting records, and deposited into the bank accounts of the organisation by Committee members. My opinion is unmodified in respect of this matter.

Opinion

In my opinion, the financial report of Victorian Water Polo Inc. presents fairly, in all material respects the Victorian Water Polo Inc.'s financial position as at 30 June 2016, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1., Consumer Affairs Victoria, and the Associations Incorporation Reform Regulations 2012, Victoria.

Basis of accounting and restriction on distribution

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
