PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Our pathway programs were marginally better with some younger members able to train intermittently and enjoy games when available. Our referees will benefit when they see other National and International referees practice their trade. Many parents will now see the best players and how good our game is. Many past players will come back to enjoy good water polo. On behalf of our Board and Members I want to thank the following WPV members for their hard work and expertise, Gary Barclay, Russell Small, Danny Flahive, Lyn Celotti, Gareth Hunter, Lisa Flahive, Jack Mordes, Andrew Post and David Whittaker.

I wish to congratulate our staff, especially David Whittaker our Executive Officer who has worked tirelessly to reset after each lockdown. For most of 2020/2021 David has struggled alone with great results including applying for every available grant which has ensured we are in good shape financially. Under the guidance of David, the staff team is taking shape including Perri Randall (Competitions Manager) and Thomas Swords (Administration Officer). These guys are well and truly set for a post COVID return to water polo and I look forward to the new initiatives and ideas they will bring in the coming year.

I also want to acknowledge our Board members, Anna Scofield, Jodie Potts, Daniel Flahive, Gareth Hunter, Rebecca Talbot, Caleb Hawk, Kai Yang Goh, and Iain Scott. I thank each and every one of them for the support over the last 12 months. The Board has continued to meet on a regular basis to meet the continuing challenges presented by COVID and provide support to David. We look forward to finalising the Strategic Planning process which will provide a clear direction for the next couple of years as we leave COVID in the rear mirror.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

We have survived another year! What an unprecedented time we have all endured with a number of COVID-19 Lockdown periods which has caused enormous disruption to competitions and activities.

During this period a focus has been on applying for funding support to ensure that when we enter the post COVID period we are financially sound and have the opportunity to invest in strategic areas of development. While challenging, I am pleased to inform that this has been a successful endeavour with the Financial Statements showing an 83.67% increase in Net Assets and a Net Surplus of \$160,373.

With the support of Water Polo Australia (WPA) significant discounted capitation fees were extended to members to encourage registration and reflect the periods that activities and competitions were unable to occur due to limited access to pool and COVID restriction from the lockdowns periods. In part this resulted in members continuing to be engaged with only a relatively minor decline in registrations from the prior year. This will continue to be an ongoing challenge for Community Sport in entering 2022 in hopefully a COVID norm world. Particularly challenging will be the engagement and development with Sub-Juniors as they have essentially missed close to two years of being involved.

A Strategic Operations Planning process commenced during the year to align with the new WPA Strategic Framework. Input has been received from Clubs and members plus WPVic Board. It is anticipated this process will be concluded in coming months and will provide a direction for the 2022-2025 years. This will be beneficial for when we enter a new COVID norm in 2022 of operating with vaccination rather than with lockdowns being imposed at short notice. I am excited to be finally able to really start on the challenge of growing and developing the sport within Victoria.

When State League was able to commence in January 2021, competition was strong and enjoyable with players of all ages keen to be back in the water. Unfortunately, a snap COVID Lockdown caused an abrupt end to the season at finals time. It was however positive that we were able to play during summer months which had not been possible for some years. Everyone was excited to start the Winter Season after the Lockdown however after only a couple of rounds another Lockdown was announced and the season was unable to continue. At the time of writing this report we are looking forward to a time in the not too distant future when competitions and programs can re-commence. Perri Randall has been an invaluable support in her role as Competitions Manager with handling what seemed to be constant changes and challenges of preparing the State League and other competitions.

The 2021 State Team Program (STP21) has been once again disrupted with continual changes to interstate travel and border closures. The National State Championships (NSC) have been postponed on several occasions and rescheduled to later dates. The latest plans are for the NSC to be held in Brisbane in January 2022 instead of the Australia Youth Club Championships (AYCC) which have been rescheduled to April in a condensed format. Pending the re-opening of venues there remains considerable interest in VIC State Team to be prepared as best as possible in a tight time window. While the VIC teams will be less prepared compared to other states due to the lack of preparation and development due to COVID over the last 18 months, it is important that we compete on the national pathways and know what levels of performance are required. On a positive note, expressions of interest indicate that for the first time in a number of years Victoria will be able to field full teams in all age-groups and genders.

Similar to STP21, the relaunch of the Academy Program which was originally planned to commence from Term1 2021 has had to be continually postponed. It is now scheduled to hopefully start in 2022. This relaunch is an important pillar of the VIC pathways and is designed to include a broader range of development activities similar to an 'Institute' style program. These would include in addition to general polo skills, education, swim fitness, strength and conditioning, athlete wellbeing and mental health, goal setting.

While the relaunch of the Academy was not possible in 2021, the existing Academy program continued to operate when possible throughout the year. Unfortunately plans of expansion were also not viable due to lack of pool space with the ongoing pandemic restrictions. To cater for this to some degree new S.T.A.T.I.C. sessions (Skill, Training, and Talent Identification Clinics) were held in between the COVID Lockdown. It was the intention that these sessions would be a basis for expanding the Academy program as venues re-opened however further lockdown were imposed and this was not possible. These programs would not be possible without the tireless work and dedication of the coaches – Gareth Hunter, Slobodan Macic, Peter Gyorgyicsek, Greig Richardson and Hayley Morrison.

The High-Performance Advisory Panel (HPAP) was formed in 2020 to initially explore the opportunity of re-establishing teams in the Australian Water Polo League (AWL). After interest was expressed by WPA and exiting AWL Clubs plus the general support of the WPVic community, work commenced to prepare a License application for re-entry of teams. The concept was to create a ‘community-based’ club that can provide a pathway for all VIC athletes and officials to participate at a national level and inspire the next generation. This is a significant aspect to the VIC Pathways Program to stop the talent drain leaving Victoria to pursue higher opportunities. This will also have an ancillary benefit of increasing over time the standard of local competitions and programs. With a considerable amount of planning I am pleased to confirm that a license to compete in the 2022-2025 season has been granted and the new Victorian National league Club has been established. Selection trials and training commenced in October 2021 with a large group of athletes keen to be involved. Exciting time for the sport in Victoria.

With the AWL license process finished the HPAP will continue with a remit to provide oversight and support to WPVic for all pathway programs within Victoria. I would like to thank Gary Barclay in his role of Chair and other panel members (Andrew Post, Lyn Celotti, Gareth Hunter, Lisa Flahive, Jack Mordess Russell Small and Danny Flahive) for their experience, insight, and passion to make water polo in Victoria a pinnacle of the sport.

Members followed the efforts of Victorians (Rowie Webster, Lachlan Edwards, Blake Edwards and Maddie Steere) in their efforts to be selected for the Tokyo Olympics. Congratulations to Rowie, Blake & Lachlan for their selections with Maddie missing selection at the final cut. While team results did not go in Australia’s favor during the tournament members were keen to cheer on the teams and Victorians.

A national partnership has been recently announced by WPA with Belgravia Leisure which originally started as a WPVic Board initiative in 2020. This partnership has the possibility of opening up a number of venues in Victoria to the sport with pilot programs exploring opportunities with Learn to Swim and Swim Squad programs, creating new Flippaball and ‘social’ polo sessions as well as traditional competitions.

Regional development remains a focus with the regions of Geelong, Ballarat, Bendigo, Mornington Peninsula and Wangaratta have been identified as strategic priorities. Discussions with the Ballarat City Council in late 2020 for a Strategic Partnership MOU received support from the local Mayor and the Executive Team. The test event was to be the 2021 Victorian Country Championships however the competition had to be postponed the day prior to commencing in February 2021 due to a snap COVID Lockdown. While the competition was able to be rescheduled for March 2021 it unfortunately was considerably reduced in size and local promotional activities were not able to occur. Other initial discussions have been held with new venues being the YAWA Aquatic Centre in Rosebud, Gurri Wanyarra Wellbeing Centre in Bendigo, and the Wangaratta Sports & Aquatic Centre.

Access time and affordable costs of venues continue to be major impediments to the sport. This will be something that will not change in the short term however is a strategic priority to establish partnerships with venue operators and local councils. During the year there was a challenge in meeting the demands for competitions and other program activities. Discussions are ongoing with MSAC and an in-principle MOU has been agreed upon with Melbourne High School for priority hire arrangements from 2022.

I would like to sincerely thank all Clubs for their resilience and collaboration over an extremely challenging and frustrating year. I appreciate the support and assistance offered and remain excited about what we can achieve in the future.

I further acknowledge two new staff members, Thomas Swords and Lisa Hayes, who have joined WPVic in July 2021 in part-time roles of Administration Officer and Operations Support respectively. I look forward to working with you both into the future and appreciate the support to date with your initial contributions.

The Board has also continued to be great support and source of encouragement. The AGM in November 2020 saw some new Directors join the Board in Caleb Hawk, Iain Scott, Rebecca Talbot, Kai-Yang Goh and Jodie Potts. I would also like to acknowledge and thank the outgoing directors (Jo-Anne Dal Santo, Peter Whittaker, and Alex Steere) for their efforts during 2019 and 2020. The Board continued to meet on a regular basis throughout the year via Zoom. While the year was dominated by COVID Lockdowns a number of initiatives and planning were able to be achieved. I would like to thank on behalf of the WPVic community the commitment that all the Directors provide. Without their efforts we all would not be able to enjoy the benefits of participating in such a wonderful sport.

COMPETITIONS' REPORT

2020-2021 Sub - Junior Competition

Many clubs faced challenges with team entries caused by the 2020 COVID-19 lockdowns. We were delighted to commence this competition at the end of January 2021. With reduced team numbers, the competition was played mainly at Hawthorn Aquatic and Lifestyle Centre with a multi round played at MSAC. We had 6 teams competing in 12U Mixed, 8 teams in 14U Boys and 6 teams in 14U Girls. This total of 20 teams was 8 less than the previous year, with most clubs unable to enter more than one team in any division. We also had a number of combined teams and we thank clubs for working together to provide opportunities for all players. It was wonderful to have a number of new referees learning the skills of adjudicating the game with support from our more experienced referees and pool controllers. Congratulations to DVE Aquatic for winning Gold in the 14U boys and the MC Minnows for winning Gold in the 14U girls. Full results for this competition are listed later in this report.

2021 Summer State League Competition

This competition was based on a 'return to sport' for many players and an opportunity for clubs to re-engage with members and get them back into the pool after the 2020 COVID-19 lockdowns. We looked at some alternatives to re-engage members but due to limited pool space, we ultimately ran a more traditional style competition, with MSL5, 6 and 7 combining into one division with the opportunity to play a wider variety of teams. We also introduced the option of mixed gender teams in MSL6 and 7 to accommodate clubs who don't have enough women to field their own teams. Due to limited MSAC availability, we were able to use different venues including Camberwell Grammar, Watermarc and Victoria University Aquatic Centre. As with anything new, there were challenges and successes with these venues. A straight 1 v 2 final was played at the end of the season. Congratulations to the winners of this competition. Full results are listed later in this report.

2021 Winter State League Competition

48 male and 25 female teams entered the 2021 Winter State League Competition, making the total of 73 teams, 7 teams less than the 2019 State Championships. Games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at MSAC, Watermarc and Victoria University Aquatic Centre. We congratulate regional clubs Geelong (MSL3/4) and Ovens and Murray (Youth Girls/ WSL2) for entering teams into this competition and for making the long drive each week. MSAC were able to complete some minor works on the outdoor pool to allow us to run a 3-pool set up across the pool on a Tuesday and Thursday night and a 30m competition pool for the men on a Wednesday night. This was a benefit and will allow for better use of water space in the future. Unfortunately, due to the ongoing COVID 19 crisis, this competition was unable to be completed due to further lockdowns. Ladder results at the end of available play are listed later in this report.

REFEREE'S REPORT

During the 2020/21 financial year, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, most of the usual WPV water polo competitions have been cancelled.

- All traditionally held competitions were cancelled, except:
- A Summer Champs comp was held from early in the year
- The 2021 Sub Junior (12&U and 14&U) Sunday competition that normally runs from October to March each year, was shortened and actually (thankfully!) completed with finals on Sunday March 28.

The referees available for these competitions number 86. This number is up slightly from 2019/20. As is usual, some listed referees signalled they would no longer be available, but we continue to have junior referees indicating an interest in starting to referee.

With the cancellation due to Covid-19 of the 2021 WPA Australian Youth Water Polo championships in Brisbane as well as none of the usual interstate competitions, opportunities for our younger referees to continue to develop were extremely limited. It was therefore very pleasing to see a number of them step up and begin refereeing mid-week Club games during the truncated Summer and Winter competitions. These young referees of promise include:

So, we have around 15 active and developing younger referees (13 last report).

Referee Pay and Assessment

The current pay scale for WPV referees has been the same since 2018 and compares favourably with rates paid at other states. It can always be improved, but is not seen as a pressing issue.

One issue that needs resolution is the suggested higher pay for the occasional situation where a senior referee has to referee a game by themselves. This occurs maybe 10 or less times over a whole season where for various reasons, a scheduled referee cannot attend their game.

Only a senior referee will be scheduled for such an occasion. The suggested pay rate would be \$40 per game.

WPV Referee Uniforms

There are around 10 referees who currently need a red WPV referee top, so more of these need to be ordered.

The 2022 WPA Australian Youth Championships

These remain scheduled for next April 2022 in Brisbane. Advertising for WPV referees at these championships should begin before we receive notification from WPA.

We have not been well represented in terms of numbers of WPV refs attending since the 2019 AYC, and it would be good to see our numbers increase in 2022.

Benefits include:

- Improvements for WPV (and WPA) refereeing standards
- Clear subsequent pathways for referees
- Flights, accommodation paid for as well as a per game allowance for individual referees

ACADEMY OF EXCELLENCE REPORT - MEN

I started working with Victoria Waterpolo from the 19th of April 2021 as Coach of the Men's Academy. Trainings are held 3 times a week from 5:30am – 7:30am at MSAC. From the first day to the end of May we trained as usual. On 21 June, we started with training after a break of 20 days. In July, we had a break from 15 – 27 July and in August we only had 2 training sessions. During this usual training period, my concept is based around this model:

- Introductory training, warm ups, plus some swimming which has maintained their condition and fitness.
- The main part of the session was focused on technique with the ball. We worked on various passes, receiving the ball from both the left and right side, high and low passing, quick and strong passes. Followed by moving with the ball forward, backwards, left and right. I covered all models with the players relating to passing and receiving of the ball. I focused and worked on fixing their leg work, their positioning of body and their hands and arms when releasing the ball. We worked mostly in pairs in order to have high intensity training. I believe I managed to fix some technical aspects however there is a constant need to keep working on execution of technical elements. Of course through working on their passing, in vertical positioning we have also strengthened their legs which are very important in this sport. I worked every training approximately 30 mins.
- We then moved on to shooting where we tried to implement the taught techniques in shooting. I must say that the entire group of players who attended the academy are all at a similar level of shooting and passing. They are all at an average level and everyone can do much better.
- The last part of the training which usually lasts around 20 minutes is used to focus on tactics. In this period I have usually worked on an extra man scenario. Through this working we have learnt new skills through this specific segment of play. We equally worked on attack and defence. In defence I encouraged them to come out and have a good block which would protect part of the goal. For attack we worked on being high on their legs, to move left and right into space and to shoot when they recognise when they can see that they can score.

This is somewhat my concept during the period of 19 April – 2 August. I believe that this has come in good time as they don't have many sessions with their clubs and I also believe the motivation was not at the highest level probably because of the lack of quick competitions at a high level.

We started training in middle of September and other than the usual players of the academy we also had players join us who would like to play for the new Melbourne waterpolo club which will play in the national league of Australia. Usually that number of players is around 30. Because there was a prolonged period of no training or games, I usually work on basic elements of swimming, techniques and shooting. I believe it is important that they need to have good conditioning in order to do specific things.



NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the Entity is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. These financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001 .1 The Entity is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the mandatory Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the Corporations Act 2001 and the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the directors have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with those of previous periods unless stated otherwise.

The Entity has concluded that the requirements set out in AASB 10 and AASB 128 are not applicable as the initial assessment on its interests in other entities indicated that it does not have any subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures. Hence, the financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements were authorised for issue on the date shown on the Declaration by the Directors.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

a. Income Tax

The entity is exempt from Income Tax.

b. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

d. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

e. Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

f. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

g. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

h. Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

i. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The directors evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Entity.

j. If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

k. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.




