PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Once again I have great pleasure in presenting this Annual Report for Victorian Water Polo Incorporated (VWPI) for 2007/2008.

It has been a fruitful twelve months and VWPI has continued to develop and grow. The Board has restructured staffing arrangements and administrative processes which have resulted in greater efficiencies. A new full time Executive Officer has been appointed and we welcome Shane Oliver on board.

I would also like to thank all those who ensure our sport is administered and managed in a very professional manner. Special thanks go to Board members who have spent a lot of their personal time in managing their various portfolios and in some cases assisting in other areas. Our contracted part time office staff also deserves many thanks, Sam Oliphant in accounts, Jo Fox in development and Tony Ryan in administration and competitions. Unfortunately both Sam and Jo called it quits late in the year. Carmen Stocks has replaced Sam and the Board is currently interviewing for a Development Officer. I would especially like to thank Simon Weatherill and Adam Luscombe along with their staff at MSAC for all the support they provide to VWPI. They have been extremely flexible and have worked very closely with Ted Donovan, Competitions Director, in accommodating our needs. Finally, thanks to all the competition coordinators, pool controllers, referees, coaches, managers and officials who put in an enormous amount of work into making our sport the success it is.

The construction of the raiseable floor at the outdoor pool at MSAC was completed on time and within budget. We are back to gaining access to the new facilities from 6:30pm onwards in the evenings and early in the mornings. The evening timeslots mean greater flexibility for junior game sessions at reasonable hours. Junior participation has dramatically increased however continued effort needs to be maintained in the area of junior development. The obvious growth still emanating from the increasing popularity of the sport in schools is welcoming.

Congratulations to all those members selected as State, National League and Australian representatives either as players or officials. The EDC program is having an impact on player development which is now being borne out in many competition results. Many thanks go to Australian Water Polo for their continued support of the program in Melbourne.

The bulk of our funding is still provided from members' registrations and match fees. Continuing Government grants were also received from both VicHealth and SRV which mainly contribute to our development programmes. These grants will be repeated in the forthcoming year and certainly do assist in implementing the programmes in our strategic plan. Fees are being indexed to CPI and will be passed onto members which should have only a marginal flow on effect in the 2008/2009 financial year.

Finally, on behalf of VWPI I would like to express our great appreciation for the continued work done by Ted Donovan. Ted has served Victorian Water Polo tirelessly over many decades, including many years as a Board member, predominately in the role of Competitions Director. As we all know, without Ted game nights would not run. Ted is retiring from his position on the Board along with its associated responsibilities; however he will still be involved as a Pool Controller.

Ted is synonymous with Victorian Water Polo and we wish him all the best as he takes life a little bit easier.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Over the course of this year the role of Vice President has focused on governance, policy and administration. There have been a number of accomplishments this year in the following areas:

Administration

- Appointment of a full-time Executive Officer in conjunction with the President and Coaching Director. Jon Sieben was appointed to the position but unfortunately resigned after a few months. Shane Oliver was subsequently appointed to the role. Shane has provided excellent support to the Board and has been instrumental in securing additional funding to VWPI to progress with additional strategic initiatives as well as introducing a number of initiatives to improve administration practices in the VWPI office.
- Assistance to the Executive Officer to appoint an IT Service Provider and establish new computer capabilities within the office to enable better sharing of computer resources, external access to the office software, data backups and ongoing support.
- Collaboration with the Victorian Country Water Polo Association to streamline the registration process for those who participate in Victorian Country Championships.

Judicial

- Completion of a VWPI Judicial Policy. This document outlines the processes to be followed in the case of reports by referees or other breaches of VWPI Policies such as Codes of Conduct. Report books have been created to enable referees to quickly complete match reports during a game to enable players to be notified of a reportable offence and the basis for the report.
- A number of Tribunal Appeals have been investigated and addressed.

Recommendations of the future:

- A matter of concern has been the increasing number of written complaints to the Board by members against officials. Each matter has been investigated on its

merits with appropriate recommendations to the Board. It is recommended that the next Board implement enhanced education, professional development and supervision for officials to improve professional standards and provide a better service to our members.

- A volunteer Member Protection Officer is needed to help address specific issues referred to the Board.
- The Constitution also needs to be modernized to better serve the needs of the Board and members.
- The Competition By-Laws also need to be updated regarding eligibility provisions for Division 1 as there have been a number of exceptions that have been requested by clubs and permitted by the Board. A strategic review is recommended for the Competition structure supported by relevant Competition By-Laws.

REPORT OF OPERATIONS - 2007- 2008

VWPI State Office

2007 saw significant change within the VWPI State Office. It was a time for re-organisation with the result being a full time Executive Officer and Sports Development Officer being appointed. These appointments were made due to the hard work put in by the board and staff members resulting in grants from Sport & Recreation Victoria and VicHealth.

A major focus for the 2008 – 2009 year will be closer ties between the VWPI State Office and clubs which has been recognised as an area for improvement.

Additional new technology has been installed in the VWPI office that, together with a full-time office manager, will greatly improve office productivity.

Clubs & Membership

The number of affiliated clubs and associations remained static during 2007-2008 with St Kevin's Aquatic and Seahorses joining and Sunraysia again dropping out. Membership registrations increased (1127→1253) primarily due to the two new clubs bringing a host of new age-group players into the 2008 Winter competition.

Events

After the staging of the Commonwealth Games and the 2007 FINA World Championships over the last two years and then works on the Outdoor pool at Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre, Victoria has not hosted a National championships event for some time but will be back on the National calendar over the next few years.

Victoria did host the 2007 Australian Schools Championships at MSAC immediately after the FINA Championships with competitors and officials praising the MSAC facilities, the new timing systems and use of the video scoreboard.

COMPETITIONS REPORT

National

Medals were scarce for Victorian age-group teams in National competitions over the year with the Junior 20/U Men being the only success bringing home the bronze. However, it was pleasing to see that teams were mostly competitive and showed continued improvement.

The Board opted not to enter a Victorian representative team in the 14/U National Club Championships. However, Melbourne Collegians sent a club team which finished in a creditable 5th place in a strong 15 team competition.

The School Boys and Girls teams both enjoyed success in Brisbane with silver and bronze medals respectively.

The Board congratulates coaches, managers, referees and athletes of these teams and thanks all for their ongoing efforts and enthusiasm. Without the support of these people, and of the parents of team members, VWPI would not be able to have teams competing at the National level.

Victoria

The 2007 State Championships were held in the Outdoor pool and Diving pool at MSAC and again saw an increase in the number of teams with 41 Men's and 24 Women's competing.

For the second successive year, NYP Dragons and Footscray were respective premiers in the Men's and Women's State League 1 competitions while Melbourne Collegians took out both male age-group competitions.

The 2007 Winter Competition saw a move back to the indoor facilities at MSAC due to works on the outdoor pool and unfortunately, a return to late games. The Board thanks clubs and teams for their cooperation and understanding during this time. The number of teams showed a further increase with 45 Men's and 24 Women's teams taking part. New teams from St Kevin's Aquatic and Seahorses were welcomed into the male age-group competitions and hopefully will continue to field teams in the future.

Congratulations to all grade premiers and individual award winners over both competition series.

The nature and number of incidents coming before the Tribunal is still a concern and the Board will continue its stance of using the tribunal process and penalty provisions within the new Judiciary policy to stamp out such behaviour.

All games in the Sub-Junior competitions (12/U and 14/U), were this year held on Sundays at Hawthorn Aquatic Centre. The competition was well supported with team entries once again having increased which meant very long days for players and officials. The season again ran from October 2006 through to March 2007 with players remaining in the same age group into the new year.

These Sub-Junior competitions are vital for the growth of the sport in Victoria providing a great learning experience for younger players as well as being a lot of fun. Many thanks again to all those who assisted with these competitions, especially our younger referees and to clubs and parents for fulfilling their duty roster commitments.

MSAC Aquatics Manager Adam Luscombe and his staff have been most accommodating in trying to meet all our requirements to successfully run our regular competitions. VWPI thanks them for their assistance and looks forward to continuing this relationship.

Thanks also to the management and staff at Hawthorn Recreation Centre and South Yarra Sports Centre for their continued support of our competitions and training.

As always, thanks to everyone who volunteered as table officials, goal judges, computer operators, referees, pool set-up/pack-up etc. during our regular competitions. We must also mention the great work done each week by our Pool Controllers and Ted Donovan who has handled the difficult task of scheduling referees each week.

DEVELOPMENT & COACHING REPORT

The Victorian Water Polo Coaching and Development Portfolio is a crucial element of the development of water polo in Victoria.

Throughout 2007/08 there have been key initiatives and relationships built to support sport development. This includes funding for specific projects from the Department of Community Planning and Development (Sport and Recreation Victoria), VicHealth and the State Sporting Centre Trust (MSAC). It takes many years to create change and I have been impressed by the efforts of all staff, board members and of course the tireless volunteers within water polo who continue to move the sport forward, thank you.

Examples of Sport Development programs include;

- The Referee Development Program;
- Coaching Courses run in metropolitan and regional Victoria, sending coaches to interstate level 2 courses and supporting assistant state team coaches;
- The joint development of a Flippa Ball Program with AWPI and QLD water polo;
- Provision of opportunities for the Deaf Children's Community and CALD (Culturally And Linguistic Diverse) Communities within metropolitan Melbourne to be introduced to Flippa Ball

- Training MSAC staff for FlippaBall programs;
- School Clinics;
- School Competition Support;
- Pathway development;

State Teams are also a core aspect of the VWPI water polo calendar. Results for all State Teams can be found in the Competitions Report.

Thank you to all state coaches and managers for all the hours of work put in (as listed on page 1) and thank you to the coaches and managers who have mentored their colleagues to provide a consistently high level of coaching to our junior teams.

It is a logical pathway for a young coach to work with a mentor in a training and tournament environment, with game to game and day to day challenges/decisions to contend with in real time. I would encourage any aspiring coaches to apply to work with our head EDC coaches and appointed State Team coaches to gain this experience.

There have been several meetings throughout the year to discuss the direction of junior programs and "pathways". Scott Schwieckel, National Development Manager has provided input into the pathways for players, coaches and referees based on the AWPI model. A collection of ideas will be the platform for further development of this in 2008/09.

VWPI sponsors the Victorian Tigers National League teams for men and women and would like to thank the coaches, managers, volunteers and supporters for their efforts in making the home games a success and in assisting athletes to be the best they can be.

The Victorian High Performance Program, the Victorian Elite Development Centre for Women and for Men is the pinnacle of recognition for athletes in Victoria as they embark on their pathway to National and International competitions.

I would like to thank AWPI and the Australian Sports Commission for the ongoing funding of the Elite Development Centre and to MSAC for their provision of facility training time, thank you. Thanks are also extended to the Victorian Institute of Sport who support four of

the EDC athletes with individual scholarships. These athletes are Larissa Webster, Rowena Webster, Chris Gronow and Ryan Moody. Rowena received a nomination from the VIS for the 2007 VIS Awards of Excellence: Youth Award.

The program can not happen without the support of parents, the VWPI office and of course, the two coaches. Grieg Richardson and Peter Smith must be commended for their ongoing support of the athletes in their water polo, personal and professional development. The tireless energy they both commit to making the programs more than just a water polo skills session is fantastic. From the programs inaugural year in 2002 there has been implementation of selection policies, uniform expectations, weights programming, swimming programming, nutrition, motivation and planning seminars and the program will continue to provide opportunities to all high performance athletes. Some of you may not realize both Greig and Peter have been recognized in the Australian coaching community through their involvement with National Coaching commitments and camps.

I would also like to thank David Marks (High Performance Manager), John Fox (National Men's coach) and Greg McFadden (National Women's coach) for their ongoing interest in the program, along with the coaches who run the program in the absence of Greig and Pete at State and National competitions, Lynne Morrison and Darren Steere.

MARKETING REPORT

Over the past year Marketing has been involved in 3 projects aside from general board business and they were in the following areas:

1/ Judicial Report Books

Setting up of artwork and the printing of the VWPI Judicial Report books. This job has been completed and the new Report books have been in use on the pool deck for the duration of the winter competition.

2/ Flippa Ball Logo, Postcard and Poster Graphics:

Setting up of artwork and the printing of support material for the launch of the Flippa Ball Clinic Program. A logo for the Flippa Ball program was designed and approved for use in the marketing of the Flippa Ball Clinics. This was used on the promotional postcard that was printed for letter box drop purposes for the advertising of the first Flippa Ball Clinic.

The other piece of marketing material that was produced was a generic poster to support the marketing of the Flippa Ball Clinics. This poster, A2 size, is generic in the way of the date set up and was designed for use at pools and local schools. The artwork for the poster could also be used for future newspaper advertising.

My thoughts on the Marketing of the next Flippa Ball Clinic would include local newspaper advertising through the Leader or Journal newspapers. This would be taken out 2 weeks prior the start of the clinic and in conjunction with the letter box drop of postcards in the area targeted for the clinic.

3/ Junior Competition T-Shirt Graphics:

One of my aims for marketing water polo at the junior level this year was to have our juniors wearing their own water polo competition t-shirt. My design has been approved but unfortunately we ran out of time to get it out for the 2007/08 competition. With a lot of the ground work already completed, I am hoping to get this project finished for the start of the new 2008/09 competition and to see our juniors advertising water polo to the masses as they wear their t-shirts during the summer months.

Looking forward to the coming year I would like to finish off the Junior Competition T-Shirt

project and to look at marketing, design and print, to support school, Flippa Ball clinics and potential new players of our sport.

- We have no plans to abandon lines of product or other plans or intentions that will result in any excess or obsolete inventory, and no inventory is stated at an amount in excess of net realisable value.
- Provision has been made for material losses arising from the fulfilment of, or an inability to fulfil, any sale commitments or as a result of purchase commitments for inventory quantities in excess of normal requirements or at prices in excess of prevailing market prices.

Work in progress

- We have made provision for all expected future losses on contracts entered into at the reporting date, based on estimated costs to complete, including appropriate overhead expenditure.

Property, plant and equipment

- Rates of depreciation, applied to reduce book values of individual assets to their estimated residual values, reflect the probable useful lives of those assets to the association.
- Allowances for depreciation have been adjusted for all significant items of property, plant and equipment that have been abandoned or are otherwise unusable.
- The association has no 'make good' obligations in respect of its property, plant and equipment for which it would be required to make a restorative provision under AASB 137 Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets which have not been included in the financial report.

Capital management

- All disclosures in the financial report in respect of capital management processes reflect actual processes in place during the reporting period.

Electronic publication of financial report

- With respect to publication of the financial report on our website, we acknowledge that:
 - a. we are responsible for the electronic presentation of the financial report
