President's report

I am pleased to present the 2014/15 Annual Report of our Association Water Polo Victoria (WPV).

WPV has had another marvellous year but it has had its challenges. I would like to sincerely thank the support of the Board and the staff during this year who ensure that our association and competition is managed in a professional manner.

I want to thank all involved in our sport and in particular the volunteers who are the backbone and unsung heroes of our community. These people include:

- competition co-ordinators, pool controllers, referees, coaches, managers and officials for the Association, regional associations, schools and the clubs who put in such an enormous amount of work to making our sport the success it is,
- the office staff – lead by Simon Blundell, Tony Ryan, Tom Madden, Michael DeFina, and Deb Vawdrey for their ongoing hard work for the running and development of the sport,
- Board members who have spent a lot of their personal time working to improve what we do,
- the MSAC and Melbourne High School staff for the support they provide to WPV,
- pathway program coaches who support the pathway program for promising athletes and the VIS input into our sport,
- WPA staff and board for their support, in particular of the VIS program and also for their recognition of the ongoing work in Victoria to grow water polo from the grass roots to the elite level,
- funding bodies VicHealth and Sport and Recreation Victoria (SRV) and the

contract managers who support the WPV staff in their work,

- and of course all the players who have enjoyed the competition during the year, be it your first attempt at the sport, as an experienced player or seasoned veteran.

A highlight has been the progress made with the integration of the Victorian Seals into becoming a true community asset. Performance in the pool was great with the Men playing in the finals and the Women's team just missing out on a count back. The President Steve Blunt and his Board has taken great steps towards a sustainable business model which is starting to become the envy of the national water polo community. This is based on sound governance, good sportsmanship, inclusion, and partnering. The profile of water polo has been lifted by partnering with such organisations as beyondblue and the Victorian Olympic Committee and conducting games at regional venues like Wodonga and Frankston. It is clear that running events attracts more attention to our sport and the Seals have some big plans for the 2016 season. The Seals will be hosting the NWPL finals in Melbourne in 2016 (another first).

Recently, WPV has agreed with WPA that the Victorian Seals is now an integral part of the Victorian (and Australian) high performance pathway. This allows all junior players to aspire to one day play for the Victorian Seals. This gives Victoria a unique pathway which I believe will lead to a more inclusive water polo community. The Seals as a team is owned by the Clubs and something we can all be proud of and contribute to (regardless of the Victorian club you belong to).

The inaugural Water Ball was held as fund raiser for Water Polo Victoria and the Seals but more as an opportunity to create an icon event

in which we can come together to celebrate all things good about water polo, our community and having fun. It was a great night and next year's date has already been set

Congratulations to all those members selected as State, National and Australian representatives either as players or officials.

The project funding from VicHealth has completed its fourth and final year. Water polo delivered a fantastic result which VicHealth were delighted with. It was focused on increasing participation of women and girls at all levels of our sport, from the board and subcommittee level, through to coaches, officials, referees and players. The project has also allowed us to focus on sustainable organizational change to support WPV to further develop a water polo environment that is safer, more accessible, inclusive and equitable. Whilst we do not have all the answers, we certainly have delivered what was asked. VicHealth funding is now more focused on event participation and WPV will look to work again with VicHealth in the future.

We thank SRV for their continued funding as they continue to support organisational development and recreational water polo opportunities.

It was pleasing to see the return of U14 and U12 competition to Hawthorn Aquatic and Leisure Centre all be it only for one season. The City of Boroondara, after working with WPV, reneged on previous commitments to be a water polo centre and have made it totally unviable under current management to use this pool. The good thing is that Hawthorn has been designed, built and equipped for water polo but we will need to wait for the current Council to turn over and for more community focused members to see common sense. Council elections are in 2016.

For the U14 and U12 sub-junior competition, we will use the new Ringwood pool as the focus (replacing HALC) and other more accommodating and reasonable facilities. The growth of this age group is critical to future sustainability of water polo in Victoria and must be the focus of all clubs not just some.

There are some exciting facility development projects underway. PARC at Frankston was commissioned this year and even hosted a national league game. They are welcoming of water polo and the formation of a Frankston based club is well underway. Ringwood is the newest facility to open and will be the focus of the sub junior competition. It is hoped to also use Greensborough, Noble Park and Melbourne High. This is very positive for water polo at a community level.

There has been a more than full contingent on the board (having a non-voting member) for the past couple of years, achieving a diverse board membership of youth, experience, skills and passion. I thank the Board for their contribution and to those that are not re-elected I wish them all the best as I will also warmly welcome new members.

Secretary's Report

This is my second year on the WPV Board, and my first year as Secretary. It has been a rewarding experience to be involved in developing the strategic direction for WPV, and I have been fortunate to be able to draw on the expertise of John Perrott and Bryan Wee in moving into this new role.

I would particularly like to acknowledge the dedication of our Executive Officer, Simon Blundell, and our Sport Development Officer, Tom Madden. Their efforts in streamlining

administrative and financial processes, developing our sport and exploring ongoing funding opportunities have been significant this year, and WPV is in a good position moving forward as a result. Tony Ryan's ongoing work in ensuring that the competition runs smoothly is also integral to WPV's success.

This year has heralded some significant challenges relating to changing funding models from state government, and ongoing issues relating to pool space at Hawthorn. However, we have had many positive outcomes for the year, including the implementation of regular Council meetings, the review of our Constitution and strategic work around risk management, sponsorship and marketing. The Victorian Seals have also continued to move from strength to strength under the expert governance of Steve Blunt and the Seals board. Their continued work has been instrumental in developing the profile of water polo in Victoria, and I commend them for their dedication and persistence in this area.

Priorities for the Board next year include developing competition pathways, securing ongoing funding and sponsorship, and identifying ways to further expand our sport. A key objective will be the review and development of a new strategic plan to ensure that water polo in Victoria remains both successful and sustainable.

In closing, I would like to acknowledge and thank the volunteers within WPV and our various clubs, who dedicate numerous hours each week to ensuring our competitions run smoothly- they are critical to the success of our sport.

Clubs & Membership

This last year's membership numbers increased marginally from 1232→1249.

Female participation is an ongoing concern reflected with junior numbers steady but senior female registrations falling by 10%. Again there were insufficient teams to create a Junior Women's (18/under) competition.

Membership numbers were up and down across most clubs with DVE Aquatic and Geelong Marlins showing strong growth particularly at the junior level.

As shown by the successful Flippa Ball program in Geelong, junior development programs are vital as the continued development of younger players is the best option for clubs to grow. Clubs are urged to raise their efforts in this area.

Unfortunately after securing access to the Noble Park Aquatic Centre, new club SE Phoenix folded after struggling to establish a membership base.

Online registration using Sporting Pulse is now used by all clubs with an email-driven membership renewal program implemented in July 2014. In the main this was successful for all clubs but highlighted the need for members to keep WPV and their club updated with email address changes. It is also critical that members and clubs follow the correct process when transferring clubs including from interstate. Too many members just initiate a new registration with their intended new club bypassing the (financial) clearance step and creating database duplicate entries requiring additional admin time to resolve. Clubs need to work harder with new members to inform them of the correct Transfer process.

Operations Report

Having made it through my first full year cycle I have my eyes firmly fixed on the horizon and the things that still need to be done to get water polo in Victoria to where it rightfully belongs – as a sport of choice for anybody and everybody. However this report is also my opportunity to glance in the rear view mirror and reflect on the year that has just gone, and what a year it was, there is plenty to celebrate.

Normal operations again saw successful State Championships, Sub-junior, and Winter competitions run and won. The Victorian Junior State Championships were hosted by the Geelong Marlins in what was a very successful event and saw us live stream the last day of the competition allowing family and friends to tune in and for all the athletes to go and watch their games back in the days and weeks that followed. It also saw teams from Tasmania join us for the weekend which really added to the atmosphere and we hope to see them up here again next year.

At the representative level we had men's and women's teams attend the National U20's competition in Sydney and whilst the results were not quite as we would like, it was a great effort given that the teams were relatively young and many of the athletes were attending for the first time. The East Coast Challenge saw three Victorian teams (two boys and one girls) attend and battle it out with the other states in sunny Brisbane. For the first time in a while the pathway program also sent a boys and girls team away to the Trans-Tasman Challenge, which provided them with a terrific opportunity to train for and attend a competition together. We hope to be able to send them away to more competitions together as the program continues to evolve.

On the sport development front we held the first Women in Water polo forum that saw athletes

and parents come together to hear from a number of guest speakers such as our own Rowie Webster and Bridgette Ireland, together with experts from outside of water polo such as Nicole Livingstone, Lara Davenport, and staff from the Victorian Institute of Sport. There have been Come & Try events at Brighton Baths, numerous school clinics, presentations made to SSV regional groups as we continue to develop and strengthen our relationships with the schools. The first Seals Experience day also ran at MSAC recently and there is ongoing work to establish a new club in Frankston aligned with the Mornington Peninsula Flyers swimming club.

The office has also been working very closely with the Victorian Seals to put water polo firmly in the sports entertainment category with events such as the NWPL *beyondblue* cup and Spirit of Olympic Sport event that were part of the National League season. Next season promises to be even bigger and better with the introduction of the NWPL Pride Cup and the securing of the National League Finals to be held in Melbourne next March. I hope to see all of you there, supporting our athletes as they strive to put Victoria on top of the podium as we lead into the Olympics this time next year. Socially the Water Ball was a terrific event and provided an opportunity for us all to come together to celebrate all that is good about water polo. Next year's date has already been set for April 16th so start getting your table organised and I expect to see you on the dance floor!

Behind the scenes in the office we have been working hard to understand the trends that are evolving in sport and how these will impact water polo. As part of this process we have undertaken surveys examining the female pathways and the factors that impact female participation in water polo. We have also looked at the issue of social participation and how water polo can adapt to attract participants

as part of this emerging demographic of sports participants. I would encourage all clubs to check out the short video put together by the CSIRO because understanding these trends will help clubs adapt their approaches and products in a way that will assist them to grow. Both of these reports are currently being finalised and I look forward to being able to share the results with you shortly

In addition to this we have been working closely with Water Polo Australia to refine our athlete pathway to make it clearer to not only those of you who are already involved in the sport, but to those who are considering becoming involved. This is particularly important as we work to build our relationships with the schools programs as this is often the first exposure young people have to water polo and to be able to clearly define the pathway for the sport will help to attract and retain them. With regards to the schools, we have been meeting regularly with the APS and are working toward some joint activities with them designed to enhance our relationship. Similar work is also being done with the AGSV and GSV schools. Tom and I have also presented to two School Sports Victoria regions and are actively looking at how we can get more schools playing water polo. The establishment of the Sporting School product, currently being put together by Water Polo Australia, should help to accelerate this once it come on line early next year.

Over the course of last year we have had three new facilities come on line, PARC in Frankston, the new Ballarat facility, and the Ringwood pool has also just opened. Considerable time and effort has gone into establishing relationships with these and to securing opportunities for water polo. PARC has hosted State League and National League games and will host the Come & Try program we are currently working with the Mornington Peninsula Flyers on, Ballarat has hosted a demonstration game as

part of its opening weekend and we thank Essendon and Richmond for providing teams for that event. Ringwood has literally just opened its doors and we are in discussions about securing pool space for our Sub-junior competition to be based there.

At this point I would especially like to thank both Tony Ryan and Tom Madden who have both put in countless hours and kilometres in establishing and building these relationships so that the entire community can benefit. In addition I would like to thank Terri-Anne Scott, President of the Ovens & Murray Water Polo Association, for her ongoing engagement and assistance as we work to strengthen our ties with the region. I would also like to thank MSAC who continue to host the majority of our competitions and with whom we continue to engage regarding water polo events both small and large.

As many of you will know our three year (that become four year) grant with Vic Health finished on 30 June and the funding bodies have evidenced a clear intention to shift their focus when it comes to the allocation of grant money to projects and sports that actively demonstrate that they can deliver on the important issues of increased social participation opportunities that are inclusive of everyone. Our policy, and the policy and programs offered by clubs, need to be clear in their message and execution that **“Everyone can play”**.

Despite our grant having finished we continue to work closely with Vic Health, the staff of Sport and Recreation Victoria, and VicSport to address the requirements of our sport and to look for opportunities to improve what we are doing and how we are doing it, and we thank them for their support during the year. This year has also seem a greater level of engagement with the Sports Minister, Mr John Eren, and his staff, and we look forward to

welcoming them to a number of events across the coming year and thank them for their support of water polo.

The year ahead again promises to be a challenging one, but an extremely exciting one and I invite you all to work with me to make it awesome.

Congratulations to the Seals management team in partnering with the *beyondblue* Foundation to stage the *beyondblue Cup* to kick-start the season – a large crowd enjoyed two very tight games and the night went off with a bang – pyrotechnically!! The Spirit of the Olympics was another successful night and both initiatives will be carried forward into next season - great work.

Staged in collaboration with the Victorian Olympic Committee - **The Spirit of the Olympics** night - saw a number of past Olympians from many sports attend for pre- and post-game social gatherings. Another wonderful initiative from the Seals which will continue into the future.

Victorian

2014 State Championships

The 2014 State Championships saw 51 male and 24 female teams competing in 12 grades including an Ovens & Murray Men's and a Women's team in State League 1.

Again there was no Junior Women (18/U) competition due to lack of entries – a worrying trend in terms of female participation.

Venues were MSAC and Melbourne High School with games played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both venues with Ovens & Murray games being played on Saturdays at MSAC and in Wodonga. Two State League 1 Men's games were trialled at the new Peninsula Aquatic and Recreation Centre in Frankston prior to the National League games with a number of other grade games played at the Watermarc pool in Greensborough hosted by DVE Aquatic. Both new venues were a success.

7 clubs shared the 12 premierships with State League 1 Men's and Women's finals both ending in penalty shootouts – MC Titans and Footscray winning the respective pennants. Melb Collegians were again the most successful club with 5 premierships.

2015 Winter Competition

The 2015 Winter Competition season was shortened to 7 rounds and a grand final due to closure of the MSAC pool for necessary maintenance. 52 male and 25 female teams competed in 13 grades with Ovens & Murray having a SL1 Women's and Youth Boys and Girls (16/U) teams. Again there was no Junior Women (18/U) competition.

Games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both MSAC and Melbourne High School with Ovens & Murray games played on Sunday afternoons at Watermarc in Greensborough.

9 clubs played off in the Grand Finals with premierships shared across 5 - Melb

Collegians (5), NYP Dragons and Richmond (2), DVE Aquatic and Essendon (1).

With Grand Finals abutting school holidays, the Women's SL1 and Youth Girls finals involving Ovens & Murray teams were not played due to scheduling difficulties. Steps have been put in place for the future to ensure this doesn't happen again.

Congratulations to all grade premiers - results for all grade competitions are listed later in this report.

2014-2015 Sub-Junior Competition

The competition returned to Hawthorn Aquatic Centre after a 3 year wait for redevelopment of the pool with mixed feelings. While the pool generally is a great venue for water polo, WPV was forced into sole usage of the pool and having to play at both ends to ensure financial viability. This meant the 12/U competition was somewhat compromised by playing in the shallow end but overall it was successful with generally positive feedback from coaches, players and parents.

There were 18 teams in the competition - 8 12/U Mixed, 8 14/U Boys and 4 14/U Girls.

Games were spread across 4 venues – mostly at Hawthorn and Melb High School and occasionally at Greensborough and Noble Park.

Teams played "double header" games on alternate weeks at Hawthorn and every week at Melb High which again proved a successful format.

WPV thanks everyone in the Sub-Junior community for their help and support in the staging of this competition – having multiple grades at Hawthorn did make it easier this year for those players participating in both 12/U and 14/U competitions. Thanks also to all our younger developing referees for their time and efforts and to those senior referees who took on the mentoring role and being Pool Controllers at each of the venues.

2015 Junior Club Championships

The Victorian Junior Club Championships moved to the Kardina Aquatic Centre in Geelong for the first time and were played over the weekend of 21-22 February.

With 32 teams and over 280 players from Metro and Regional clubs, the 90+ games through the weekend meant a very busy schedule for everyone especially the Geelong Marlins volunteers who worked tirelessly through each day setting up the 3 pools, handling the match books and results sheets and then packing up at the end of each day. Congratulations to Julie and John O'Callaghan for their initiative to bring this event to Geelong and for all aspects of their organising to make the Championships such a success. A great effort!!

A highlight was having the medal games on Sunday "live streamed" by **My Sport Live** giving families and friends back in Melbourne, Albury-Wodonga and down in Hobart the chance to "tune in" and see the kids in action. Thanks to Tom Madden for putting this together – and for his "voice-over" commentary.

Congratulations to all players and coaches for the spirit in which all games were played – and

to those teams and individuals who won the medals and individual awards. And well done to the 12/U who played their games and posed for their **Hydralyte** photos with such great enthusiasm.

The Referees Commission has provided support to all WPV referees over the last year by way of feedback, encouragement, conduct of Forum's and basic referees' courses (2).

This year we also provided specific information and referee courses for Schools prior to the start of their season.

The introduction of the new modified rules for the 14 and Under National Club Championships was a positive step last year. There is a link on the WPV and WPAL websites to the interpretation of these new modified rules. Whilst WPV has not embraced all of the modified rules the referees have had to be cognizant of the differing rules at the Junior, School, and Senior levels.

The Referees Commission would like to acknowledge the important role that the Pool Controllers do every week of competition. They are first contact for questions on the pool deck and the first area where players go to check their game details.

This year saw the departure of Stephen Wight to Alice Springs. He has been a stalwart of Victorian water polo for many years. We wish him well and acknowledge the gap that has been created in his leaving; in refereeing, pool controlling and referee coordinating. Good luck Wighty!

The National Grading system for referees was introduced 2 years ago and provides a pathway for referees wishing to progress at a National level. There are a number of our WPV referees who are now graded within this National system and who can now nominate for the various National Age Championships, leading up to NWPL and FINA representation. Keep up the interest and participation at the National level; it can only help at the State level as well.

Congratulations to Danny Flahive as he represented AUS at the World Championships this year; great effort yet again, Danny.

As I step down as the Referee Coordinator and Commissioner this year I would like to thank all

of those people who have assisted me over the years; Ted Donovan, Gillian Manson and Tony Ryan in particular. The work that is done behind the scenes continually amazes me.

The Commission will change in format at the end of this year and I hope go on to grow the number of referees available to officiate in our game.

To those of you who pick up a whistle each week and do the job to the best of your ability, thank you. Keep up the good work!

Regional Development Report

The 2014/15 period has seen Ovens & Murray putting a strong emphasis on development and promotion of the sport, as well as looking to a number of new initiatives in an attempt to strengthen the sport. Communications between Water Polo Victoria and Ovens & Murray has seen another prosperous 12 months, with the state body working with the regional association more closely to provide support and opportunities for regional athletes.

Our season ended with the young Albury Tigers A Grade men beating the extremely well drilled Sharks in a thrilling game 9-8 and the A Grade women saw a show down between Sharks and the Pool Pirates with the Sharks ladies being declared victorious 8-2. The season culminated with celebrations and it was a great privilege to have a number of Waterpolo Victoria referees in attendance; Alby Morrison, Danny Flahive and John Mason. A great day of polo for all.

Once again we saw the Victorian Seals team coming to the Border taking on Cronulla Sharks

during our finals series but this year we included four up and coming players from within our Association, Brooke Dickie, Bridget Johnstone, Alhana Hofer and Trent Remington. The Ovens & Murray hope to be able to secure more National League fixtures to support the Seals movement in coming years for developing regional areas and in 2016 we see the Victorian Seals take on the Adelaide Jets in January at the WAVES facility.

Ovens & Murray athletes were once again well represented in the Victorian East Coast Challenge sides. Congratulations to all our U/14 players who represented Victoria; Tegan Roberts, Meg Waite, Sophie McLeod, Darcy Millet and Ambrose Mills who attended all training and four of the five athletes being selected in the main squad to go away.

This year saw Ovens & Murray sent its first U/18's team to Nationals for a while. This team took 6th place in what can only be said to be bottom aged, coached by Brendan Dickie. A fine display from a little regional team.

U/14 Nationals was held in Albury/Wodonga, this being the first of five years. This competition saw 36 national teams come to the border with Ovens & Murray entering 2 teams. This was a great week of waterpolo and saw a few of the senior referees within Waterpolo Victoria work closely with eight young up and coming boys, fostering them in the development of their umpiring skills. This was a great weekend and provided a lot of opportunity for networking between Ovens & Murray and Waterpolo Victoria.

Ovens & Murray teams have once again entered into the metro winter competition for the Open Women and youth girls, with both sides managing to make it through to the grand final. Unfortunately, due to scheduling these games were not played.

Finally, the Ovens & Murray has also managed to enter a women's side in the SL1 competition this season. At the time of writing this report the season has not yet commenced.

Ovens & Murray have received great support from Water Polo Victoria over the past 12 months, and we all look forward to continuing our positive working relationships into the 2015/16 season.

Development Report

What a year! And I mean that quite literally. As I write the development report for the 2015 Annual General Meeting it marks 12 months of working with Water Polo Victoria in the SDO role, almost to the day. This past year has not only involved trying to develop our great sport in the water, but has involved numerous out of the water activities that have put us in a great position moving into a new year for the sport in Victoria. Whilst there are always a few low points over a 12 month period, I want to focus on the successes we have had over my time in the office – celebrating key aspects of our growth and development over the past 12 months. Whilst not stealing the thunder of other reports in the AGM report, I think it is important to focus on some of the specific highlights for this year from the development point of view.

Let me start by making mention of the Women in Water Polo funding which until recently was a strong foundation for the development of water polo in Victoria. Whilst the funding had to end eventually, we were fortunate to receive the extended funding for 2015 which enabled us to continue working on a number of projects that Simon and my predecessors had started. We also took the opportunity to undertake some of our own activities, some of which are

still in the process of being finalised for publication. Of these works, we undertook two separate studies focusing on participation rates and activities within our sport. One of these focused on current and lapsed members, looking to assist the office in critical decision making processes in the future. The other investigated the options available to WPV in the form of social programs that encourage participation outside of our regular competition. We look forward to being able to present these important pieces of research with you in the near future.

The funding also allowed us some flexibility to get some assistance to improve our presence within the school networks, whilst also having some help with the creation one of our key events for the year – the Women in Water Polo Forum. I would like to thank Fiona Hutton for her assistance in these areas as without it we would still be planning the event. I would also like to thank all of the presenters, athletes and parents who attended the forum and hope that everyone found the experience to be a positive one. Whilst we undertook many activities under the Women in Water Polo banner this past 12 months, the key partner in all of this has been VicHealth. Without the provision of funds from VicHealth none of this could have happened so I would like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank them for their assistance throughout the funding period, especially given Simon and I both entered the scene within 12-18 months of the funding coming to a close.

Communication continues to be a key focus from a development perspective, as the continued development and variety of our communication methods allows a broad array of coverage across the wider community. We have once again seen a significant growth in our communication channels this year, with the continued use of Facebook, Twitter, a monthly newsletter and our website. To broaden our reach and to provide some variety in the

communications area, the past 12 months has seen the addition of a WPV Instagram account which has grown to 205 followers since its inception. Our Facebook page has seen a 400 person increase in followers, and our Twitter account now has 250 more followers than it did 12 months ago. Whilst our newsletter distribution list numbers have remained at around the 2,000 mark, each edition continues to be well received by the community. The newsletter will now be distributed every two months, as the ability to produce the publication on a monthly basis no longer exists. We envisage that this will ensure that each edition will be full of relevant and important information for our members.

The Victorian Seals National Water Polo League Club continues to go from strength to strength and whilst not technically falling under the development banner from my role, the Seals have made their way into my report for the past 12 months because of their importance on the state and national scale in promoting water polo in a positive light. The Seals are also a significant stage in Victorian athlete development pathway, and allow us to have elite level athletes on show across the state during the NWPL season. From the development side of things, the Victorian Seals have played an important role in encouraging participation across the state and have played important roles in regional and metropolitan Victoria. This year saw the Seals playing home fixtures in Wodonga and Frankston, further strengthening Victoria's relationships with facilities outside of the central zone in Melbourne. Seals athletes have also played some key roles in the running and assisting with junior water polo sessions, with the most recent of these being the complete organisation and running of the Seals Experience Days which were held at MSAC in August. The Seals will continue to play an important role in the large scale development of the sport across Victoria and we look forward

to working closely with them during their upcoming campaign which will include marquee events such as the NWPL *beyondblue* Cup, NWPL Pride Cup, Spirit of Olympic Sports Night, and hosting the NWPL Finals Series here in Melbourne. I encourage all members of the community to show your support for the Seals by attending their home games and supporting the athletes who continue to fly the flag for Victoria on the big stage.

From a program and event perspective we have had a busy 12 months. Whilst it sometimes may seem like not much is taking place, I can assure you that there has been a number of initiatives in operation since our last AGM. Whilst no development activity is clearly more important than other when it comes to driving participation and building positive relationships with the wider community, there are a couple of initiatives and events that I would like to highlight. The first of these was the Polo by the Pier event which was largely run by the Old Melburnians which saw the Nepean Cup sparking the jovial rivalry between Point Lonsdale and Portsea Surf Life Saving Clubs. The event was held down at Portsea Pier and was well attended by members of the water polo community. This saw the best that water polo has to offer rise to the surface with club rivalries put to the side and members joining forces to create their own teams. Congratulations to the Old Melburnians on a great event and we look forward to seeing it back in action this December.

Another key event on the calendar for 2015 was the Water Ball, which provided an opportunity for clubs and members of our community to gather and celebrate the successes of the year for both WPV and the Seals. The night was well attended and everyone seemed to have a fantastic time, with next year's event already being locked in for April 16th 2016. We encourage everyone to

mark the date in your calendar. We have also been having ongoing conversations with members of the school sport community and are excited by the opportunities that lay ahead in this area.

Looking forward to the next 12 months there are some exciting times ahead for our great sport. Not only will we see the return of many of our valued social events, we will also see the return of the Brighton Baths Fast 5's event in February which unfortunately didn't take place in 2015. This adds to the excitement of external events for the water polo community and will hopefully be well received and attended.

In addition to this, I would like to welcome our newest club to the water polo Victoria community, the Frankston & Mornington Peninsula Flyers Swimming & Water Polo Club, or Flyers for short. The swimming club has been working closely with WPV to become a joint swimming & water polo club and will be holding a Come & Try program through October and November to recruit members to the club. Keep your eyes peeled for the Flyers in upcoming events and competitions. We also have an exciting opportunity in Ballarat which is being discussed after the opening of the new 50m pool at the Ballarat Aquatic & Lifestyle Centre. Whilst discussions are still underway, we are hoping to see water polo being played in Ballarat in the near future. We are also continuing to work closely with local councils and facility planners to ensure water polo dimensions and requirements are considered for all renovation or new projects across the state. This is purely a taste of the exciting new ventures that will be undertaken in 2016 and we ask for your support to ensure the ongoing growth and development of our sport can be maximised as we head into an Olympic year!

Financial Year 2014 / 15 in Review

The financial accounts for the year ended 30th June 2015 are basically prepared on a cash basis and as such can be affected by timing of Receipts and Payments when comparing to previous years comparatives.

As is contained in the reports of the President and the President of the Victorian Seals Inc. the board of WPV decided in 2013/14 Financial Year to support the establishment of a new Victorian National League team. To enable this to happen WPV in 2013/14 Financial Year undertook to pay to MSAC and WPA the outstanding debts of the previous National League team the Victorian Tigers and to financially underwrite the Victorian Seals for a period of 2 years to enable them to have working capital and to allow the recruitment of Board members knowing the Victorian Seals had this financial backing. While the Victorian Seals had a separate board ultimately WPV paid to the Victorian Seals \$49,372 which includes \$10,000 in Sponsorship to underwrite their operations for the 14/15 season.

The accounts show a total loss incurred for the 2014/15 year of \$52,685.20, including \$49,374 paid to the Victorian Seals. If this is deducted there was an operating loss of \$3,312. I will make some comments in regard to these accounts and the budget for 15/16 Financial Year as follows:-

- The accounts are mainly prepared on a cash basis. There was one tournament which was very close to 30th June 2014. We have made every attempt for all revenue and expenses to be picked up in this financial year to ensure there has been a proper matching of revenue and expenses in the financial year they were incurred. Please note there was approx. a net \$10,369 of expenses that were paid this year that related to tournaments that were otherwise accounted for in 2013/14.
- Club Presidents would have recently received a letter from the President of Water Polo Victoria outlining the end of the Vic Health Grant. This letter was also posted on the WPV Website on the 11th June
- The Vic Health Grant was for \$120k in the last financial year.
- VicHealth earlier this year signaled a change in funding direction from targeted communities to participation based activities.
- Our community based funding from VicHealth ended on the 30th June and whilst Vic Health have been delighted with the activities and outcomes delivered by WPV, we need to make some changes in order to facilitate the growth and development of the sport. This will require us to change our focus to participation based activities to attract further grant funding
- We have a small staff and any changes to the level of grants will have wide-reaching impacts.
- The Board is looking at all opportunities to find ways to continue running our competition, developing our sport, and supporting both participation and high performance. We are currently examining all costs and all revenue opportunities but we needed to look at how we can sustain the existing office functions and this has led to increased fees for games and registrations.
- The grant from the Sport and Recreation also ended at June 2015. We have been granted some interim funding through to December 2015 whilst the new funding model is finalized and the criteria established.
- Increasing fees is never a popular decision to make and as a community we collectively need to find ways to grow our member numbers, reduce costs such as pool hire, or attract other revenue via sponsorships or donations.

- We have been looking at Come and Try, Flippa Ball, Inner Tube water polo and other social participation opportunities. These activities along with initiatives such as the Water Ball are very important and need to be supported by the entire community.
- Our Debtor position has also improved with payments arrangements in place with long outstanding debtors. The total debtors at the end of June was \$53,651.92 of which only \$1,354 or 2.4% was 90 days and over.

At present, VWPI has several main sources of income:

- Registration / Competition fees received from Members
- Grants received from funding bodies including:
 - Victorian Government's Department of Sport & Recreation
 - VicHealth (Finished at 30th June 2015)
- Income from athletes participating in VWPI provided development programs

The VWPI Board is still seeking to broaden the association's income base with the achievement of ongoing, sustainable sponsorship income, as well as looking to create a recreational arm to our sport in Victoria.

I would like to thank our bookkeeper, Deb Vawdrey from Southern Bookworks. Our prior auditor retired during the year and I would like to thank Ravi Mutyala for conducting our audit this year.

I would also like to thank our E.O. Simon Blundell. Simon has made changes to our accounting procedures and has been instrumental in getting our outstanding Debtors well under control.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 June 2015

a. **Income Tax**

The entity is exempt from Income Tax.

b. **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. **Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

e. **Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f. **Cash on Hand**

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

g. **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

h. **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

i. **Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.**

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

j. **If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.**

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

k. **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

l. **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

In making those assessment, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Associations preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by [those charged with governance], as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

Inc. to maintain the integrity of the data presented. The examination of the controls over the electronic presentation of audited financial reports on Victorian Water Polo Inc.'s website is beyond the scope of the audit of the financial report.

Emphasis of matter

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report which describes the revenue recognition policy of Victorian Water Polo Inc. Since cash receipts form a part of the income of the organisation, it is very difficult to establish an internal control system capable of verifying the total income received by the organisation. Therefore there were no satisfactory audit procedures that we could perform to obtain reasonable assurance that all receipts were properly recorded. The scope of the audit has been limited to the income recorded in the accounting records, and deposited into the bank accounts of the organisation by Committee members. My opinion is unmodified in respect of this matter.

Opinion

In my opinion, the financial report of Victorian Water Polo Inc. presents fairly, in all material respects the Victorian Water Polo Inc.'s financial position as at 30 June 2015, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1., Consumer Affairs Victoria, and the Associations Incorporation Reform Regulations 2012, Victoria.

Basis of accounting and restriction on distribution

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
