I would especially like to thank Simon Weatherill and Adam Luscombe and their staff at MSAC for all the support they provide to VWPI. They have been extremely flexible and have worked very closely with our staff in accommodating our needs. Finally, thanks to all the competition co-ordinators, pool controllers, referees, coaches, managers and officials who put in an enormous amount of work into to making our sport the success it is.

Congratulations to all those members selected as State, National League and Australian representatives either as players or officials. The VIS and the Tier 2 and 3 programs are having an impact on player development which is now being borne out in many competition results. Many thanks go to Australian Water Polo for their continued support of the program in Melbourne.

The bulk of our funding is still provided from members' registrations and match fees. Continuing Government grants were also received from both VicHealth and SRV which mainly contribute to our development programmes. These grants will be repeated in the forthcoming year and certainly do assist in implementing the programmes in our strategic plan. Fees are being indexed to CPI and will be passed onto members which should have only a marginal flow on effect in the 2009/2010 financial year.

Finally, it is with some sorrow that I announcing my retirement as President and from the Board. Having served on the VWPI Board over the last 15 years in a number of positions, the last 7 as President, I feel it is time for a change and for a fresh face to take the helm. I have enjoyed my Board tenure immensely, working through some of the tough times and now the good with many talented and dedicated people. Rest assured I will be staying involved in the sport in the capacities of a player, referee and official.

The current Board represents a well balanced mixture of youth, experience and passion to drive our great sport forward. I wish them all the best and hopefully to seeing most of you on the pool deck at some stage in the future.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Throughout the 2009-2010 season, VWPI has had a great year of success both in and out of the pool.

Although it was only just one year, from my memory and time involved in Victorian Water Polo, it would be the best year we have had in the men's competitions for quite some time. To start with, the U-14s, U-18's & U-20's all competed for gold in their respective age groups. In addition, these achievements were followed up by the great success of Victorian Tigers and Victorian School Boys who won the National Championships in their respective competitions. Furthermore, a large number of Victorian boys/men throughout all age groups have competed for spots in the national teams, including open men's.

In relation to the women/girls program, as the board has acknowledged, the junior teams are unfortunately not at the same level as the boys yet. However, we are committed to continue to support the programs & teams that will enable our girls to continually improve, develop and compete for medals at national championships. The Victorian Tigers women's team had another successful year, yet again making finals under new coach Travis Bloom. Their future looks bright and hopefully their first open national medal is only a year away. Furthermore, in relation to the success of Victorian Tigers Women, it is great to see two members (Victoria Brown & Rowie Webster) cementing their spots in the Open National Team both competing in and winning many international medals. I wish them all the best while they continue their push for a spot in the Olympic team, and hopefully gold at London in 2012.

It has also been a year when new programs, for all members of the water polo community, have been implemented. In particular, the introduction of Tier-2 and Tier-3 programs, has been very successful in allowing coaches to be appropriately selected to run the various men's and women's programs, in all age groups. In addition to the player/coaching pathways, we have also introduced a Refereeing Commission to help train and develop current and future referees in Victoria, something that has been overlooked in the past. Furthermore, to aid the continuing development of players, Water Polo has been reintroduced into the VIS. This

is great achievement for the sport and is an important step to our continued success. The board is very keen and committed to programs such as these in order to both make Victorian Water Polo successful, and to continually develop players and provide them with a chance of playing in national teams.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the following for all of their time and efforts throughout the year:

- Victorian Tigers board for their continued support and develop players throughout Victoria.
- The coaches of all state and local teams throughout the year, with many great results and many more to come.
- Referees who are an integral part of all competitions.

REPORT OF OPERATIONS - 2009- 2010

VWPI State Office

The year 2009-10 was best characterised as a year of change as we held our focus on continuous improvement across all areas of our operations.

Critical areas of change include:

- The introduction of a Tier 1 VIS program to our athlete development pathway, which in turn has allowed us to restructure our remaining development pathways to allow excellent opportunities for athlete and coach development
- The introduction of a Referees Commission and a program for improving training and development of our Referees
- Communication enhancement by (a) greatly improving our website (b) introduction of Facebook and (c) use of emails to communicate to clubs
- Enhancement of our governance, including revision of Board processes to assist in decision making, and ensuring we have a full Board of Directors to manage the association
- Enhancement of our financials by introducing stricter controls, sound policy and resolution of older items that impacted our balance sheet
- Commencement of a new constitution to move our association forward
- Commencement of a new strategic plan for the next five years to move the association forward
- Introduction of a strategic approach to facility planning to improve availability of pool space for our sport
- Commenced a specialist Sponsorship & Marketing committee so that we can secure long-term additional sources of income to the association
- Continued efforts under our Sports Development grants to make Water Polo a sport that is accessible to a wide range of participants over a range of ages
- Building involvement in schools Water Polo by taking on the management of the AGSV / MHS competition. We see this as a first step in helping to build a

far stronger and effective schools

Additionally there has been fantastic opportunities for celebration including:

- Victorian Tigers Men's team winning the National League in May
- Victorian Schoolboys Team winning the Gold Medal at the National Schools Championships in May
- Victorian 20's Men's Team winning the Silver medal in front of a home crowd at the 20's National Championships in July
- Victorian 18's Men's Team winning the Bronze medal in the 18's National Championships in January
- The Aussie Stingers – which includes Victorian representatives Victoria Brown and Rowena Webster winning Gold at the recent 6 Nations tournament, as well as Silver medals in the FINA World Cup and the World League
- The Aussie Sharks achieving fourth in the World League

Congratulations and thanks go to all participants in our Victorian representative squads and Australian representative squads

As Executive Officer I'd like to pass on my thanks to not only our team of paid staff – Julie Makohon, Tony Ryan and Carmen Stocks – but also all of you who volunteer your valuable time to making our competitions run and allow our various teams to train and travel, and also who look for opportunities to keep us improving. Thank you all for your contributions, all of which make our community such a great one to be part of.

Finally, I'd like to pass my thanks and respect to Rob Gronow who has elected to retire from his role on the Board after fifteen years of significant service to our community including seven years as President. Rob has been an invaluable and dedicated contributor to the Association and under his leadership has achieved significant change and development.

Sports Development Report

Victorian Water Polo has been fortunate to receive funding from both VicHealth and the Department of Planning & Community Development – Sports & Recreation Victoria. The funding has been granted to allow us to develop water polo in Victoria, in defined projects that have been agreed between the funding bodies and ourselves.

Julie Makohon has continued to build a strong base for Water Polo in Victoria in her role as Sports Development Officer. She has continued to build on the many developments last year, and has included:

- Continued running of Flippa Ball™ programs in a variety of settings including Aquatic Centres, Schools (Primary & Secondary) and Universities. Julie continues to build positive relationships with Aquatic Centres and Schools throughout Melbourne with the goal of introducing Flippa Ball™ to the wider parts of the community. A critical path to success with this work is the assistance of clubs to deliver the programs, using members who are suitably qualified.
- As part of our grant obligations, Water Polo programs have been introduced to a range of groups who are often disadvantaged in and disconnected from our community, including the Deaf and Newly Arrived Immigrants, Indigenous youth, and Women from communities who have limited involvement with mainstream sports. We look forward to creating many opportunities that will provide these communities with the chance to be introduced to our sport, eventually becoming involved in our Clubs.
- Continued building of our already strong ties with the Centre for Multicultural Youth (CMY), SpiritWest Services and Deaf Children Australia to assist us with effectively engaging our targeted communities and providing the best programs possible. The participation of Jamie-Lee Lewis – a Queensland and Australian representative Water Polo player who is also deaf – in Victorian Deaf Children Sports Day has been a real highlight.

- Club and Flippa Ball™ brochures have been created to provide an exciting and positive marketing tool for our sport. The brochures are available both in hard copy and on-line and we hope to attract more participants to our sport with their positive style.
- Posters that complement that Club and Flippa Ball™ brochures are being produced during this coming year. These will be a great marketing tool for all clubs particularly to attract new participants to the sport.
- Communication with Clubs continues to improve, particularly with the simplification of our website and the introduction of Facebook for our association. A survey of Clubs earlier this year indicated a fairly consistent approval from Clubs of our approach, but we seek to continue doing this better as time goes on.
- To support and strengthen Water Polo development, a number of Swimming coaches have been trained in basic Water Polo techniques to allow the introduction of Water Polo to programs held under the Australian Sports Commission's Active After-School Communities (AASC) banner.
- We are currently trialling a model for Flippa Ball™ development in Geelong which - if successful, we hope to apply throughout our state in time to come.
- Branding of our sport. Julie has focussed on creating a distinct brand for our sport, as best demonstrated later in this annual report where you'll see a page of her many designs. Branding & Marketing are critical elements that we encourage all Clubs to focus on as we work to introduce new participants to our sport, as well as show our sport proudly and effectively to the wider sporting world.

As was noted last year, a full time SDO provides great benefits to our sport as we endeavour to grow and develop, and we look forward to delivering the benefits of that role to you throughout the coming year.

Clubs & Membership

Membership numbers were unchanged over the last year (1376→1374).

Melbourne High School, a long-time water polo stronghold, rejoined our club ranks, while some metropolitan and country clubs showed strong growth particularly in the junior ranks which was most pleasing. However all clubs and the Association will need to work much harder in this key strategic area over the next year.

The development initiatives already launched by VWPI will be strengthened and expanded over the next year and clubs are encouraged to make use of the resources and support the VWPI office can provide.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

It has been another busy year for the board with many successes and challenges. There has been an ongoing focus on the formalization of process and policy through recruitment of new board members and the support of the staff.

The Secretary role has had a number of key requirements including management of the employment processes for staff including policies and reviews, sitting on the High Performance Subcommittee and working on the new strategic plan and constitutional review.

In conducting strategic review and planning sessions the Board has been able to reflect that many of the strategic plan objectives have been achieved since 2007 and a process is now underway to confirm a new strategic direction for the period 2010 - 2015. This process has included input from Ian Hanson of Hanson Media and input has been requested from the water polo community, this will continue until the plan is finalized.

There has been progress on the review of the constitution throughout the year and input will be sought from the water polo community in the coming months. Constitutional review and reform is necessary to support a strong governance structure for our sport in Victoria that reflects best practice.

There is always scope for improvement across the organization and it is hoped that with the new strategic plan and injection of new ideas this can continue.

Thanks to the Victorian Government Department of Planning and Community Development (Sport and Recreation Victoria) and VicHealth whose funding and support assists VWPI to achieve, particularly in the area of sports development with a range of Victorian communities. Thanks also to my fellow Board members and the VWPI staff, past and present, for the great work and professionalism displayed throughout 2009/10.

COMPETITIONS REPORT

Events

No National events were staged in Victoria during the 2009-2010 year but the next 18 months will be hectic. In July 2010, Victoria will host the 20U National Championships then in May 2011 the Australian Schools Championships followed by the 16U National Club Championships in Sept-Oct. All events are booked into MSAC but with the large number of teams expected for the 16U event, multiple venues will be required which will present some challenges.

It's been said many times in the past but will most certainly be the case in the next 18 months that it would not be possible to stage these events without assistance from our band of volunteers. VWPI will start a recruitment and training program during 2010-2011 to ensure we have sufficient resources on hand to make all these events successful.

National

The Victorian Tigers took the 2010 National League Mens premiership in a thrilling 10-8 final over Drummoyne. It was a nail-biting ride through the finals with Tigers securing their grand final spot with a last second 11-10 semi-final win against Fremantle Mariners. Congratulations to all Tigers players, coaches and management on a triumphant finish to their season.

Victorian Tigers Women showed they were competitive with the best through the season making it to the playoffs but falling short of the medal rounds to finish 6th for the season.

The highlights for Victorian teams at National Age level were the Australian Schools Championships where the Boys took the Gold medal with a 7-6 over NSW and the 18U Championships in Perth where the Junior Men took the Silver.

With changes to the Australian Water Polo National Championships calendar, no 20U event was held during the 2009-2010.

With the 14U and 16U Championships both now club-based, it was pleasing to see Melb Collegians, Richmond, Monash and

Essendon all sending teams away to these events. The more exposure these young players get from participating at this level, the more it will strengthen Victoria's development program.

The Board congratulates coaches, managers, referees and athletes of all teams and thanks them for their ongoing efforts and enthusiasm. Without the support of these people, and of the parents of team members, VWPI would not have teams able to compete at the National level.

Victoria

Once again, the number of teams entering the 2009 State Championships increased with 45 Mens and 26 Womens competing in 12 grades putting more pressure on pool space. Competition was again on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday nights at MSAC and on Tuesday and Thursday nights at Melbourne High School. Saturday evening games at MSAC were dropped having proved unpopular with clubs. Clubs and teams again adapted to these fixture arrangements although referee rostering did present challenges.

Unlike 2008, Grand Final Day 2009 was bright and sunny and there was action aplenty as teams vied for premiership honours with a number of tight finishes.

State League 1 saw Melb Collegians and NYP Dragons emerge as premiers in Mens

and Womens grades while Collegians won three and Monash Uni two premierships in other grades.

The 2010 Winter Competition saw a further increase in the number of teams with 49 Mens and 27 Womens teams competing. Games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both MSAC and Melbourne High School. Melb Collegians and Footscray took the Mens and Womens State League 1 premierships with Collegians again and Monash Uni taking at both premierships in the 18 & Under and 16 & Under Boys and Girls grades respectively.

Congratulations to all grade premiers and individual award winners over both competition series. Results for all grade competitions and awards are listed later in this report.

Through both competition seasons, referee assignments again proved a major challenge both in the number of referees available and rostering across multiple venues and nights. A number of education/training forums were held and new referees are starting to come onto the roster already. It will obviously take time for these to gain experience and the Board has moved to set up a Referees Commission to foster ongoing assessment and development for all our referees. Development of numbers and education of referees will continue as a priority in the coming year.

Sub-Junior competitions were again at Hawthorn Aquatic Centre on Sunday afternoons with five 12/U Mixed teams, eight 14/U Boys and four 14/U Girls teams competing. These games are played in great spirit and are a great learning experience and a lot of fun for our younger players. More clubs are encouraged to implement development programs at this level as the growth of the sport in Victoria needs to come from within these ranks. Thanks to all who assisted with the running of these competitions especially Matt Wallace-Smith who acted as Pool Controller and to all our developing younger referees.

The Board acknowledges the cooperation and work of MSAC management and Aquatics staff particularly Adam Luscombe and Trevor Croughan who have been most

accommodating in trying to meet our requirements. Whilst there are times when demands for access conflict, overall VWPI and MSAC continue to enjoy an good working relationship.

Thanks again to the management and staff at Hawthorn Recreation Centre and South Yarra Sports Centre for their continued support of our competitions and training.

Pool space continues to be at a premium and the Board and VWPI office are constantly looking to and talking with Council, school and other pool venues with the aim of spreading the competition and training load. This will be critically important with the planned closure of Hawthorn Aquatic for major renovations within the next 12-18 months.

We must acknowledge the great work done each week by our Pool Controllers Ted Donovan, Alby Morrison and Stephen Wight at MSAC and Rob Gronow and Frank Mielke at Melbourne High School. Unfortunately Ted didn't enjoy the best of health over the last year and has taken a step back but we hope to see him back on pool deck soon. Finally a big thank you to everyone who volunteered during VWPI's regular season competitions and National events as table officials, goal judges, computer operators, Referees, pool set up / pack up etc. These tasks are essential to the success of our competitions and we will target improvement in these areas over the next year through the delivery of development and training courses for our members and volunteers

REFEREE REPORT

With pleasure I can report that this year has seen the establishment and commencement of initiatives that will lay the foundations for refereeing development in years to come.

Following a review of refereeing earlier in the year the Board recommended that a Referees Commission be established with a view to addressing the shortage of referees, improving the quality and consistency of refereeing at all levels of the sport, and establishing structures for mentoring referees and providing pathways for referee development. In July the Referees Commission met for the first time comprising Danny Flahive, Michael De Fina, John Mason, Michael McNeill and Alby Morrison. The Commission will be responsible for defining the grades expected of referees in VWPI competitions, determining the grade of each VWPI referee, assisting referees achieve promotion to higher grades, determining referees from Victoria who are eligible to for National Water Polo League opportunities, and providing consultation and mentoring to referees, players, coaches and administrators on matters relating to refereeing. Details regarding the functions and operation of the Commission are now live on VWPI's website together with a number of documents detailing various tools established by the Commission, all combining to assist in the introduction of a new development pathway for refereeing. These tools include a Referee Development Pathway document, Referee Evaluation Sheets and a Referee Logbook.

One of the goals for establishing the Commission is to ensure that a meeting be held for all VWPI referees once per competition season to provide a forum where all referees can (i) raise queries and discuss interpretations of rules, (ii) receive updates on changes to rulings which may have occurred, and (iii) raise any other questions in relation to refereeing. At the time of writing the first meeting as such is scheduled for 6th September.

Two referee courses were held during the year. In October 2009 the Level 1 NOAS Referee Course was attended by 11 participants from eight clubs. In August 2010 the Level 2 NOAS Referee Course was

attended by 10 participants from six clubs. With the changes and pathways being implemented by the Referees Commission it is hoped that the numbers of participants attending future referee training courses from all clubs will increase.

Thanks to Tony Ryan for his tireless efforts in arranging referees for games throughout the year. This often involves a substantial amount of last minute running around and these efforts do not go unnoticed. Thanks to all on the Referees Commission and Gillian Manson for their combined efforts in establishing the Referees Commission and for continuing to drive the initiative forward so positively. The establishment of the Commission this year leaves the sport well placed to provide a solid foundation for the continued development of refereeing in the coming years which shall be for the benefit of all stakeholders in the sport.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

This year we have seen many exciting things happen in the development portfolio. Our two major achievements have been having a fully funded development officer for a second year and the establishment of the Tiered structure for athlete development which occurred as a result of water polo gaining status as a Tier 1 sport with the Victorian Institute of Sport (VIS).

With the elevation of Water Polo to Tier 1 with the VIS, a new structure for athlete development was required and VWPI has transitioned away from the Elite Development Clinic structure which had served Victorian athletes so well. It is fitting now to acknowledge the enormous efforts and dedication of Peter Smith - EDC Men's Program Head Coach and Greig Richardson - EDC Women's Program Head Coach. The health of elite water polo in the state and the number of athletes in national representation (and overseas) is a direct result of their efforts and guidance. These athletes and the board of VWPI publicly thank Pete and Spindles for a great job and wish them well for the future.

The VIS has appointed Dalibor Maslan as the VIS head coach for water polo in this state. VWPI has developed an athletes pathway (to work in conjunction with the coaching and

referees pathway) which after a transition period has resulted in the establishment of a Tier 2 and Tier 3 underpinning program for athlete development. VWPI has now appointed the following coaches to this program – Women Tier 2 – Sheila Langley, Women Tier 3 – Darren Steere, Men Tier 2 – Anthony Edwards, Men Tier 3 – Luke Gavin. The underpinning program and also club development programs will be supported and mentored by the VIS head coach.

Water polo in Victoria will now have up to 100 positions for development of water polo skills via the three Tiered structure. This is over and above the magnificent job done by the club and school structures. Club juniors development is a vital part of the health of water polo in our state especially with the National under 14s and under 16s being held at the club level. Now that we have the VIS and underpinning program in place and promotion of our sport coming from our Sport Development Officer, VWPI is looking to assist any clubs with junior development going forward. Some clubs do an excellent job already but if we can assist other clubs, then as Development Director I am happy to provide any assistance we can.

Financial Statements

for the year ending June 30, 2010

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Financial Year 2009/10 was characterised by the implementation of a number of changes the board believe are critical in providing strong management of association finances. Our goal was to not only have sound management practices, but to also create a budget process that allows us to strategically plan for our future in both income sourcing and expense management.

In summary, there were several key areas dealt with and issues resolved in FY2009/10. These include:

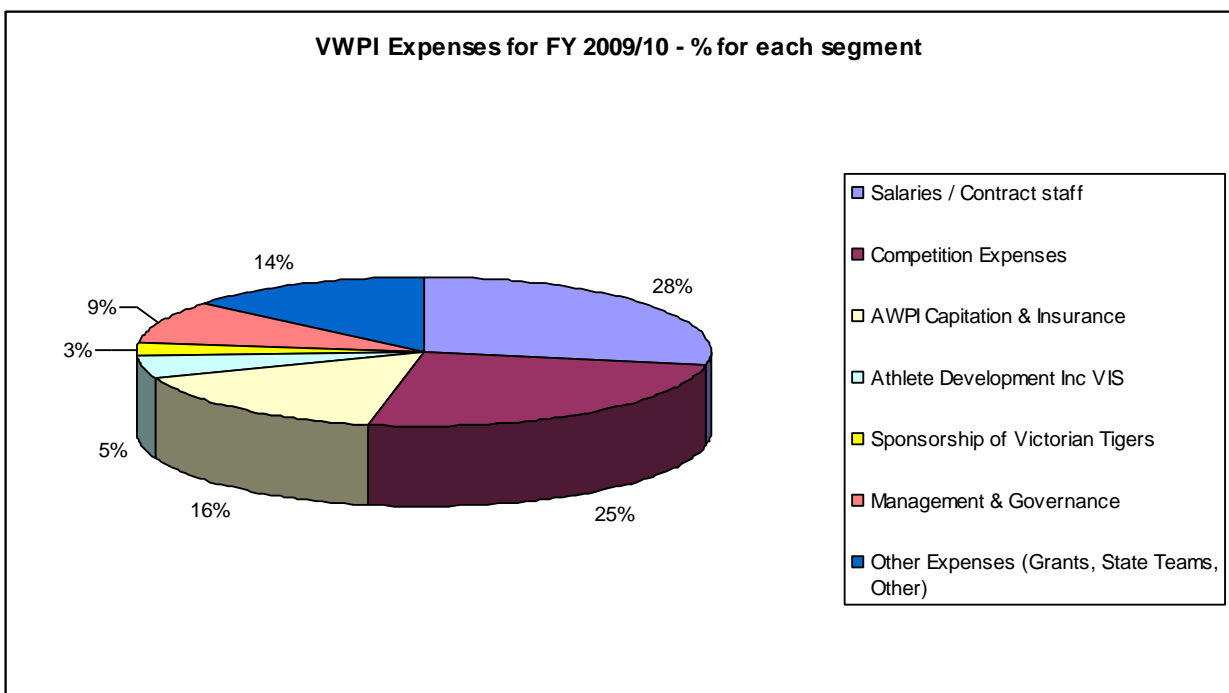
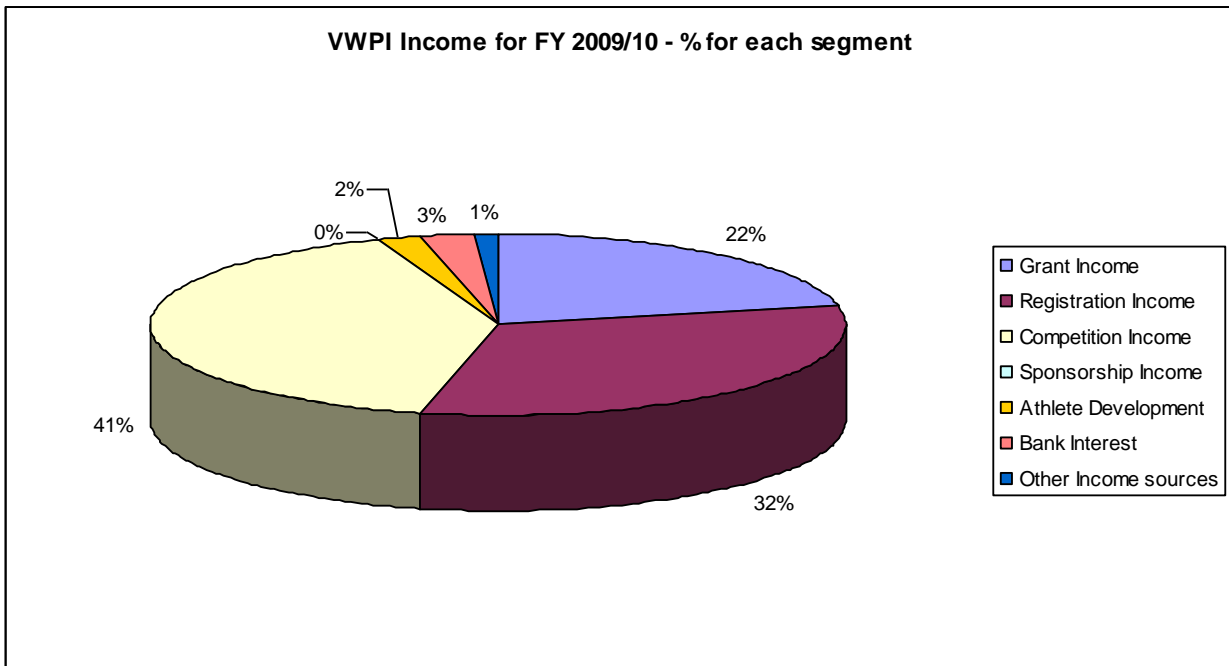
- The appointment of Simon Wallace-Smith a Partner with Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu to the position of Finance Director in Jan 2010 has provided us the opportunity to review and enhance processes and procedures
- Realising in hindsight that the FY2009/10 budget used a number of incorrect assumptions which did not become apparent to the Board until constructing the FY2010/11 budget later in the year
- A number of old balance sheet items were written off as they did not relate to current operational needs and were obscuring our true financial position. This included writing off some very old debts as well as changing accounting practices for the treatment of stock and equipment.

Key steps introduced in 2009/10

New Account structure	Introduced a new structure for account codes eff 1 st July 2010. Structure allows better reflection of the cost basis of our organisation, and also is aligned with AWPI accounting structures
Cash reserves consolidation	Cash consolidated into two accounts: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cash reserves are in an ING Business Optimiser account with high interest as well as immediate access • Operational account with CBA, allowing us to use "CommBiz" for business banking
Processes improved	VWPI moved to tighten bookkeeping processes significantly to ensure all transactions are well managed and transparent <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transactions can only be processed by our Bookkeeper if correctly authorised and cost centre-coded by responsible party – typically EO • All state teams transactions are managed directly through the VWPI books – no off-books transactions • Uniforms are not held in stock, and are only ordered as required to ensure we don't hold excess stock • All payments are dual-authorised. Typically Authoriser 1 is EO, Authoriser 2 is Finance Director. EO provides Authoriser 2 details of all transactions for which payment is requested so that Authoriser can make an informed decision about whether to accept, question or reject payment • Invoice terms reduced to 14 days (from 30 days) to allow us better cash management • All payments are now by EFT. Cheque payments eliminated except in circumstances approved by EO. Those circumstances are very limited and rare. This has eliminated a long-standing problem of cheque non-presentation that impacted our balance sheet • VWPI Board has introduced policies around stock write off. Ensures we write off all stock(balls and caps) and equipment(goals, cones, timing equipment etc) after 12 months, meaning old stock figures do not impact our balance sheet • All long-standing balance sheet items (overdue debtors, non-presented cheques, stock items) cleared from the balance sheet
Budget process	VWPI Board has introduced a budget based on cost-recovery, using costing validation of all expenditure elements. We examine the cost base of all our expenses to ensure they are valid, and then address the income sources to cover them. VWPI have built cost models for all competitions, memberships and athlete development programs. This process is critical to allowing us to now plan strategically to better generate income for the organisation.

In the pie graphs below are shown two key elements:

- The proportion of our income collected from various sources
- The proportion of our expenses allocated to various areas



VWPI made a loss for the Financial Year 09/10 of \$38,285.64. Whilst this is disappointing there was a number of one off items that affected the result. These include the writing off of \$9127.00 of debtors in excess of 12 months old where there was doubt in the records if the debt had been paid, credited or not. Stock of Caps, balls and uniforms of \$12,665 were written off to reflect the new accounting policy of only recording in the Balance Sheet those items less than 12 months old. It was also decided to bring forward a payment of \$7500.00 to the VIS program into this financial year, to allow for the effective establishment of the program.

Due to the change of Accounting software and a new Chart of Accounts it has been hard to provide an accurate comparison to the previous year's detailed accounts. In the 08/09 accounts there are a number of Revenue items that had corresponding expenses shown in the expenses i.e. State Teams. This year there

was only one account used to net the revenue and expenses off against each other for a number of activities. This is the main reason why there appears to a higher level of Revenue and Expenses in the previous year.

The changes put in place as outlined above and the Budget review process will help the finances of VWPI to be managed a lot better going forward.

I would like to thank Gill Manson for all her help as well as the VWPI Bookkeeper Carmen Stocks for her excellent contribution. Lastly thanks to John Perrott who stood in as the acting Finance Director and was a great help in the putting together the budget for the 2010/11 Financial Year.
