The Board has shown leadership in the area of safety and culture as we embrace more of a respect for the officials of the game and look for positive outcomes in the area of respect for each other. This will be an ongoing theme from the Board. We salute and thank all the volunteers who are the backbone and unsung heroes of our community that is WPV.

These people include:

- competition co-ordinators, pool controllers, referees, coaches, managers and officials for the Association, regional associations, schools and the clubs who put in such an enormous amount of work to making our sport the success it is
- the office staff lead firstly by lan Campbell and then Simon Blundell, Tony Ryan, Michael De Fina, Justin Miller, and Deb Vawdrey for their ongoing hard work for the running and development of the sport.

We had some notable staff changes with Simon Blundell joining the organisation as the new EO after Ian Campbell left to pursue other interests. Also at writing we are engaged in employing a new SDO as Justin Miller has advanced his career and has taken a more senior role outside Sport. I take this opportunity to thank both Ian and Justin for their contribution to our sport.

On a sadder note Water Polo Victoria lost a Life Member and great friend in Rob Gronow on 18 October 2013, aged just 60 years, a man who was as big in life as he was in our sport.

Whether it was at club, State or National level, Rob was passionate about water polo as an administrator, as a player and as a referee with an opinion on everything. Many facilities our sport now enjoys in Victoria can be attributed to his commitment and drive. The Victorian Water Polo community lost a great supporter.

To the athletes, congratulations to all those members selected as State, National and Australian representatives either as players or officials.

This year we saw the successful foundation of The Victorian Seals club as a community asset. Under its new constitution the member clubs of WPV are the

shareholders of the new entity. In its inaugural year the teams had outstanding success with the men's team winning the Silver medal and whilst the girls finished the season in third position, after the finals they came 6th. Given that this was a true Victorian sourced team with minimal imports an outstanding result. The Board of the Seals lead by Steve Blunt has effectively transitioned to the new structure and the impact of this has captured the attention of the whole Australian water polo community. Well done to the Board, Coaching and support staff and the players.

Our Association is funded from three sources. Firstly from players, through the members' registrations and match fees. The Board recognises that we are here to organise and run the best competition we can. Also a small but growing stream is now coming from Sponsors, which supplements our revenue. We appreciate the role played by our sponsors and I encourage the community to support those that support us.

Government grants were also received from both VicHealth and SRV that contribute to our development programs. The funding from VicHealth is in its third year and is focused on increasing participation of women and girls at all levels of our sport, from the board and subcommittee level, through to coaches, officials, referees and players. We can report major progress on this grant's objectives and positive feedback from the funding body. The project has also allow us to focus on sustainable organizational change to support WPV to further develop a water polo environment that is safer, more accessible, inclusive and equitable. SRV funding will continue to support organisational development recreational water polo opportunities.

The board this year has continued with progress on the strategic plan established two years ago.

As we are ending 2014, we have seen further development on the facilities front with the return of Hawthorn (HALC) and the pending opening of Frankston. Next year

we will have access to the new Ringwood Aquatic Centre. This is very positive for water polo at a community level. WPV has been involved early in the planning phase and able to assist these activities with support and advice. We are well placed to continue to focus on growth by increasing participation in the sport at all levels.

It was pleasing to see the continued growth of numbers in the U14 and U12 category of players participating this year. The growth of this age group is critical to future sustainability of water polo in Victoria. We hope that the use of Hawthorn (HALC) will allow continued growth.

There has been a full contingent on the board for the past couple of years, achieving a diverse board membership of youth, experience, skills and passion. I thank the Board for their contribution and to those that are not re-elected I wish them all the best as I will also warmly welcome new members.

CLUBS & MEMBERSHIP

Membership numbers decreased this year from 1292→1232.

The drop-off in membership was spread across a number of clubs with no recognisable trend observed although junior female participation is a concern reflected in the very low number of junior teams. Only one club showed any significant growth.

Again clubs are urged to raise their efforts in junior development programs particularly Flippa Ball as the sport can only grow through the continued development of younger players.

One new club (SE Phoenix) joined the Association over the last year increasing the number of active clubs to 21.

The majority of clubs are using SportingPulse for online registration and payment and again, despite some isolated problems, the system overall worked well for members, clubs and the Association. WPV will continue to work with SportingPulse on improvements to the system particularly simplifying registration.

OPERATIONS REPORT

As I sit down to write this report I am face to face with a list of challenges that are confronting us as a sport. Increasingly recreational sport is facing fierce competition on a number of fronts. competition for funding and sponsors, competition for pool space continues to dog the sport, but most critically it is competition for time. Sport has increasingly become a social activity and as such has begun competing with other social activities. Water polo is now not only competing with other sports for time, we are competing against going to dinner, watching a movie, catching up with friends and any number of pastimes that individuals enjoy. It is critical that we come together as a sport and harness our collective energy.

There are some terrific upsides, most Australians, young or old, female or male, enjoy splashing about throwing a ball around so as a sport we have a readymade appeal. Collectively we just need to package it correctly and build a strong community around it. People love to belong to something. Let's work to encourage them to belong to water polo.

As a state we have plenty to showcase. The Seals teams, both men and women, had terrific seasons and have plenty to offer in terms of potential future success. Whilst there were some administrative teething issues with the change in the time of year our U20's teams both performed strongly. Whilst the boys did not secure many victories they were competitive off the back of limited training time together. As part of the composite team our women came home with a gold medal. In both cases our thanks should go to Greig

Richardson (women) and Kieran Hattie (men) as the coaches of these teams. In addition Lyn Celotti did a great job as the men's Team Manager.

At the East Coast Challenge our boys and girls teams were again competitive with a number of athletes showing promising signs. Julia Fancher (girls) and Michael Girdwood (boys) both did a great job of preparing our teams, supported by Alan Logan and Sally Livermore as team managers.

The year has been once of change with lan Campbell leaving water polo in February to pursue other endeavours, and more recently Justin Miller departing to pursue an opportunity in his primary area of interest with a marketing company. I would like to thank both of them for their contribution to the sport. Whilst on thank you's I would like to thank the Board for firstly allowing me this opportunity and for the support they have provided me since my appointment. In addition the work done by Tony Ryan, Mike DeFina and Deb Vawdrey in the areas of Competitions, Refereeing, and Finance has been invaluable, not just for the current advice they are able to provide but also the historical perspective they are able to offer.

The office continues to work to deliver against our grants in the areas of Victorians More Active and Women in Water Polo. These grants are focusing on junior development, growth of the sport overall and ensuring that we strive to provide more opportunities for females to participate in our pathways and remain in the sport. In the area of junior development Dalibor Maslan has agreed to work with our member clubs to assist them establishing well-structured junior programs that will be sustainable in the long term. Dalibor has commenced this project with Richmond and once the program is established he will then move to another club to work with them in a similar manner. For this initiative to be a success clubs must embrace the opportunity and provide Dalibor with assistance in terms of volunteers. coaches. administrative support, and most importantly athletes.

Whilst there has been a lot of great work done there is still an enormous amount of work that is in front of us as we continue to work to improve our competition, the pathways for our athletes, coaches and officials, and the overall water polo community within Victoria. Collectively we must all strive to be better. Whilst the rivalries in the pool may be as fierce as ever I hope we can come together as a sport for the good of the sport.

To you, the water polo community, I thank you for the welcome you have afforded me but the hard work has begun and I hope you will work with me throughout the coming year.

The National Clubs Championships for 16/Under Boys was held at MSAC in October 2013 with 25 teams from all States and Territories represented while 23 teams from across Australia competed at the National Clubs Championships for 14/Under Girls in April 2014 also at MSAC. Both events were highly successful from both organisation and competition perspectives.

Internationally, the Aussie Sharks and Stingers, Junior Men and Women and Youth Boys and Girls teams again embarking tours of Europe and North America with a number of Victorian representative players and officials. with the senior teams whilst a list of younger players experienced international competition viz Gabriel Addeley, Lachlan Edwards Daniel Egan, Matt Perrott, Chris Perrott, Maddie Steere, Emily McGowan and Katie Blunt

Garry Rydberg also toured as Team Manager with the Junior Men and Daniel Flahive was an appointed referee for a host of international tournaments over the year. Congratulations to all on their selection and results – great experiences.

In recognition of her growing status in international water polo, Rowena Webster was named amongst the world's top five female water polo athletes in FINA Athletes of the Year in 2013 – WPV congratulates Rowie on this fantastic achievement.

After strong performances through the home-away season to finish 4th on the table, the Seals Women's team couldn't take that form into the finals and were knocked back to 6th in the final standings. But a great first season and a surprise to many.

Congratulations to all Seals players, coaches and management on a wonderful inaugural year achieved through a lot of hard work both in the pool and in administration.

WPV also congratulates the 2013 Victorian Tigers Men's team who were awarded the VicSport Victorian Male Sports Team for

2013 and recognises the tremendous work put in by Russell Small and Jeff Barrow over a long association with the Victorian Tigers club.

National Age Championships

Victorian teams finished with medals at 3 National Age Championships through 2013/14.

At the 20/U Championships in Adelaide in July 2014, a composite girl's team from Vic/Tas/SA won gold in an amazing effort considering the team had only come together 2 days before the tournament – a great coaching effort from our own Greig Richardson. Well done Katie Blunt who was awarded Goalkeeper of the Tournament.

The 16/U Clubs Championships were at MSAC in Melbourne in October 2013 where Melbourne Collegians boys had a narrow semi-final loss before taking bronze – an early success for new coach Slobo Macic.

Melbourne Collegians Seals won gold at the 14/U Clubs Championships in Brisbane in April with a thrilling 6-5 win over City Beach Bears - and another success for coach Macic.

VICTORIAN

2013 State Championships

The 2013 State Championships saw 52 male and 27 female competing in 12 grades including a Men's teams from Ovens & Murray in State League 1.

Insufficient entries again meant there was no Junior Women (18/U) competition with the 3 teams playing in State League 2 through the season and then playing a separate final series.

Venues were MSAC and Melbourne High School with games played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both venues with Ovens & Murray games being played on Saturdays at MSAC and in Wodonga.

Melbourne Collegians were premiers in both Men's and Women's State League 1 competitions repeating Footscray's 2012 effort to become just the 2nd club to win both State League 1 Championship titles in the same year. Melbourne Collegians were the most successful club with 6 premierships while DVE Aquatic in just their 2nd year won 3.

2014 Winter Competition

In the 2014 Winter Competition, 50 male and 23 female teams competed in 12 grades with Ovens & Murray boys and girls teams playing in the Youth Boys and Girls (16/U) competitions. Again there was no Junior Women (18/U) competition.

Games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both MSAC and Melbourne High School and in a look to the future, DVE Aquatic hosted 2 games on a Thursday night at Watermarc in Greensborough. Ovens & Murray games were played on Sunday afternoons also at Watermarc.

It was pleasing to see premierships spread across 7 clubs with Essendon, Melbourne Collegians and Melbourne University each winning 2 and to Footscray, La Trobe University, NYPD Dragons and Old Xaverian's 1 each. Due to travel scheduling difficulties, the Youth Boys and Girls premierships are yet to be played with Ovens & Murray teams featuring in both finals.

Congratulations to all grade premiers and individual award winners over both competition series. Results for all grade competitions and awards are listed later in this report.

2013-2014 Sub-Junior Competition

There were 18 teams in the 2013-2014 Sub-Junior competition - 5 in the 12/U Boys competition, 10 in 14/U Boys and 3 in 14/U Girls. The previous trial of a separate 12/Girls and 10/U Boys Mixed competition did not continue due to lack of numbers.

Competition was spread across 3 venues – Melbourne High School, Greensborough and a new venue for WPV, Noble Park Aquatic Centre. Some initial games were played at Oakleigh Recreation Centre but it was never really a satisfactory venue and WPV is no longer using that facility. Reluctance to travel to Watermarc in Greensborough was identified as another reason for the drop-off in the number of teams.

WPV thanks everyone in the Sub-Junior community for their understanding and support in the staging of this competition – it is always a challenge for families and we are grateful for their involvement. Thanks also to those who took on the role of Pool Controller at each of the venues and to all our younger developing referees for their time and efforts.

2014 Junior Club Championships

The Victorian Junior Club Championships were again held in Albury-Wodonga from 7-8-9 March.

A total of 20 Boys and Girls teams including border-based clubs affiliated with WPV competed in 14/Under and 16/Under two age-groups.

These Championships provide a great opportunity for metropolitan junior players and families to get away for the weekend as a team/club and to establish some great social contact with country clubs.

Thanks again to the Ovens & Murray organising committee who did a great job putting the event together.

Pool Space

The problems encountered with staging the Sub-Junior competition highlights the lack of suitable pool space available for water polo across the metropolitan area and WPV has and continues to work hard to establish positive relationships with Aquatics management across all venues.

While Greensborough and to a lesser extent Noble Park did draw "travel time" criticism, both are great facilities for water polo and have been most welcoming to WPV and hopefully will continue to be in the future. It is therefore critical to our sport that in future we maintain a ongoing presence at all venues.

WPV is currently working extremely hard to secure suitable pool space at the recently reopened Hawthorn Aquatic Centre and has been proactive in discussion with Councils and management regarding water polo specifications and future access to new aquatic centres currently under

construction at Frankston (Peninsula Regional Aquatic Centre) and at Ringwood (Aquanation).

The National Grading system for referees was introduced 2 years ago and provides a pathway for referees wishing to progress at a National level. There are a number of our WPV referees who are now graded within this National system and who can now nominate for the various National Age Championships, leading up to NWPL and FINA representation. Regional Development Report

The 2013/14 period has seen the regional areas putting a strong emphasis on development and promotion of the sport, as well as looking to a number of new initiatives in an attempt to strengthen the sport. Communications between Water Polo Victoria and regional areas has seen another prosperous 12 months, with the state body working with the regional associations more closely to provide support and opportunities for regional athletes and associations. The changes in personnel in the Water Polo Victoria office has not altered the progress of these communication channels, and we hope that this can continue to be strengthened moving forward.

March 2014 once again saw the Ovens & Murray Water Polo Association hosting the Victorian Junior Championships in Albury and Wodonga. This competition saw some great water polo being played by athletes from across the state including Melbourne, Bendigo and Albury/Wodonga. Whilst there was some fierce competition across all grades, it was the Shark girls that took out the U16 girl's title, and the Melbourne Collegian boys that played off against each other in the U16 boys final. Team entries were once again quite strong, but as expected were dominated by the local O&M teams. This weekend also saw the newly redesigned Victorian Seals teams taking to the water on both days to do battle with the Hunter Hurricanes. This was a

successful trip for the Seals, with both the men and women's teams coming away with two wins from two games. The O&M hope to be able to secure more National League fixtures to support the Seals movement in coming years for developing regional areas.

The annual Country Clubs tournament was this year hosted jointly by Pool Pirates and Wodonga Water Polo Clubs Albury/Wodonga. This saw some strong entries coming from Geelong, Bendigo and Albury/Wodonga teams, with the Sharks club proving too dominant across both the men and women grades. This achievement also meant that the Sharks men's team took out both the NSW and Victorian Country Club titles. Unfortunately there failed to be Victorian Country teams take part in the Australian Country competition which was held on NSW's Central Coast shortly after. This was due to a number of reasons, but mostly preparation and ability of athletes to commit to the competition. Hopefully this can be improved in future tournaments.

Regional athletes were once again well represented in the Victorian East Coast Challenge sides, with special mention going to Lily Pridham who managed to be named captain of the Victorian team. The girls also had some representatives from O&M, and managed to perform strongly against solid opposition in Adelaide. The boy's team also performed strongly, with both teams having a strong emphasis on athlete development.

Ovens & Murray teams have once again entered into the metro winter competition for the youth boys and girls, with both sides managing to make it through to the grand final. The boys will be up against a strong Melbourne Collegians outfit, and the girls will come up against the always strong Essendon side. These finals are yet to be played, but we wish the O&M teams the best of luck when a fixture is able to be finalized.

Finally, the O&M has also managed to enter a men's and women's side in the SL1 competition this season. The women return after a year out of the competition, with the

men continuing to build on their strong finish to last year's competition. One round has been played up until this point, with the O&M sides taking on Richmond. The women managed to win both of their matches, with the men splitting the points with one win each. Already this season is proving to be a much more competitive effort for the O&M sides which is extremely pleasing given their training facilities at during the winter months are mediocre at best.

Regional areas have received great support from Water Polo Victoria over the past 12 months, and we all look forward to continuing our positive working relationships into the 2014/15 season.

VICHEALTH: State Sporting Association Participation Program (SSAPP) Water Polo Victoria – Female Participation Focus (2011-2014)

Water Polo Victoria entered into the third year of significant funding aimed at working towards increasing female participation across many areas of the sport – coaching, officiating, volunteering, governance, participating, marketing etc.

The most significant achievement in 2013/14 came during early 2014 with the first 'Empowering Women & Girls in Water Polo' forum. The forum was created to provide women and girls with a safe and inviting place to provide a space for the

community assist the office in creating ideas for the office to focus on.

With the success of all the effort from the office and the community, Water Polo Victoria was granted an extension to the grant for 2014/15. In 2014-2015, WPV, along with VicHealth, aim to continue the development in the sport and finish the final year with more success.

WPV Communication

Over the past twelve months the WPV office communication has improved with a strong focus on providing community members with several platforms to source information. Our Facebook and Twitter page followers increased by 150% respectively, with up to date scores, upcoming course and important information provide on the page. This in turn saw the website traffic jump dramatically as well.

WPV significant success was the introduction of the newsletter. August 2013 saw the first Water Polo Victoria newsletter go out to over 2,000 registered members. With articles from our Executive Officer, Club Presidents and Director of mentoring the newsletter provided community members with a great read.

We understand there are more areas to improve and we look to continue this stronger emphasize on communication to our members.

Athlete Education & Care

WPV continued to improve provide the community with athlete development opportunities through our Director of Mentoring. Dr Allison Van Ommen, again ran regional athlete development workshops held in the Oven's and Murray region. This program was run also for metropolitan community members as well. WPV will look to continue to provide development opportunities such as this alongside our Director of Mentoring.

Victorian Seals National Water Polo League Team

WPV continued to actively support its elite national representatives, with the focus on the rebranded Victorian Seals, by providing support with marketing and branding materials. WPV continues to develop strong ties with the club leaders and continued supporting the team that represents our state.

Financial Year 2013 / 14 in Review

The financial accounts for the year ended 30th June 2014 are basically prepared on a cash basis and as such can be affected by timing of Receipts and Payments when comparing to previous years comparatives.

As is contained in the reports of the President and the President of the Victorian Seals Inc. the board of WPV decided to support the establishment of a new Victorian National League team. To enable this to happen WPV undertook to pay to MSAC and AWPI the outstanding debts of the Victorian Tigers of \$22,782 and to financially underwrite the Victorian Seals to enable them to have working capital and to allow the recruitment of Board members knowing the Victorian Seals had this financial backing. While the Victorian Seals had a separate board ultimately WPV was required to pay them \$54,491 to underwrite their operations for the 13/14 season.

The accounts show a total loss incurred for the 2013/14 year of \$104,164.71, including \$77,273 spent on the Tigers and the Seals. If this is deducted there was an operating loss of \$26,892. We had hoped to break even however a number of events took place that were not budgeted for or were not fully allowed for in the budget for this year. The major items are as follows:-

- There was budgeted \$10,000 in Sponsorship this year. A number of Product Sponsorships were achieved during the year; however despite numerous proposals to a number of potential sponsors there has no financial sponsor of the sport in Victoria.
- The accounts are mainly prepared on a cash basis. There were two tournaments which
 were very close to 30th June 2013 as such some expenses were picked up in this financial
 year, but the revenue was in the previous financial year. Every effort has been made this
 year to ensure there has been a proper matching of revenue and expenses in the financial
 year they were incurred.
- There was a loss from the ADP program of \$16,524. This program has had a major review and will be totally revamped in the current financial year.

The result is disappointing and not acceptable to the board and further scrutiny of the budgeting process and expenses has already taken place. It is anticipated that the Victorian Seals will breakeven next financial year and further funds from WPV will not be required.

At present, VWPI has several main sources of income:

- Registration / Competition fees received from Members
- Grants received from funding bodies including:
 - o Victorian Government's Department of Sport & Recreation
 - o VicHealth
- Income from athletes participating in VWPI provided development programs

The VWPI Board is still seeking to broaden the association's income base with the achievement of ongoing, sustainable sponsorship income, as well as looking to create a recreational arm to our sport in Victoria.

I would like to thank our bookkeeper, Deb Vawdrey from Southern Bookworks. Deb has continued to review our Chart of Accounts, review our policies and procedures, budgeting and the way the financial results are reported to the board.

I would also like to firstly thank Ian Campbell for his help as well as our new EO Simon Blundell. Simon has already come to grips with the financial processes. I would also lastly like to acknowledge our auditor Suzanne Hume from Wattle Accounting who again provided us with our audit report.

a. Income Tax

The entity is exempt from Income Tax.

b. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

e. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f. Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

g. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

h. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

 Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

 If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

k. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Auditor's responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that I comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report whether due to fraud or error. In making those assessment, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Associations preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by [those charged with governance], as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting my audit, I have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.

Publication of the audited financial report

If Victorian Water Polo Inc. intends to electronically present the audited financial report and auditor's report on its internet website. Responsibility for the electronic presentation of the financial report on Victorian Water Polo Inc.'s website is that of the committee of Victorian Water Polo Inc. The security and controls over information on the website should be addressed by Victorian Water Polo Inc. to maintain the integrity of the data presented. The examination of the controls over the electronic presentation of audited financial reports on Victorian Water Polo Inc.'s website is beyond the scope of the audit of the financial report.

Emphasis of matter

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report which describes the revenue recognition policy of Victorian Water Polo Inc. Since cash receipts form a part of the income of the organisation, it is very difficult to establish an internal control system capable of verifying the total income received by the organisation. Therefore there were no satisfactory audit procedures that we could perform to obtain reasonable assurance that all receipts were properly recorded. The scope of the audit has been limited to the income recorded in the accounting records, and deposited into the bank accounts of the organisation by Committee members. My opinion is unmodified in respect of this matter.

Opinion

In my opinion, the financial report of Victorian Water Polo Inc. presents fairly, in all material respects the Victorian Water Polo Inc.'s financial position as at 30 June 2014, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1., Consumer Affairs Victoria, and the Associations Incorporation Reform Regulations 2012, Victoria.

Basis of accounting and restriction on distribution

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the Committee's reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
