PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to present the 2018/2019 Water Polo Victoria (WPV) Annual Report.

Over the past 12-months the Board has progressed a number of initiatives. The development of these initiatives will continue in 2019/20 and will include the conclusion of the following:

- creation of committees to assist operations and the board in:
 - high performance, the Social side of our clubs and a junior pathway funding group;
- working more closely with Public States Schools, initially in primary ages, to introduce water polo to a wider community;
- creation of a State Calendar so all participants can plan their water polo well in advance;
- completion of the required changes to our constitution as a high priority;
- a restructuring of our competition structure in terms of:
 - playing more in the summer months;
 - bringing boys and girls back together on the same night;
 - tournament event competition, especially for juniors. This could lead to regional rounds;
 - inviting all water polo schools (initially current schools) to enter our winter competition. Most school teams have a high percentage of non-club players. The APS doesn't have a finals fixture.
- using MSAC for Home days where one club hosts another from 12s through to SL1. Each club could be rostered a home day;
- continue the good work done in the Primary and Secondary schools competitions one day.

The Board has faced many challenges over the past 12 months – both externally and internally – and I am grateful for the support of my fellow Board members and the wider community since I assumed the role of President of Water Polo Victoria Inc. in February 2019.

The sport itself is also facing a number of challenges, including the Sports Australia's initiative to change our membership from a State model to a National model. The Board has provided all clubs with a summary of the pros and cons of the proposal and in the near future we will seek further input from the clubs on this very important matter.

I would like to thank the Board for its work during the year. I would also like to thank our staff – with a special thank you to Sharon Logan who has assumed the role of Interim Executive Office on short notice. I also extend a big thank you to the army of volunteers - pool controllers, referees, coaches, managers, officials, parents and the clubs - who contribute an enormous amount of time and service to our sport.

The Board's job is to support and encourage participation at all levels and to ensure a safe, happy and inclusive environment for all. Congratulations to all those members selected as State, National and Australian representatives, either as players or officials and to all the players who have enthusiastically participated in and supported water polo in Victoria this past year.

2019 National League

There is still no pathway open for a Victorian team to participate in the National League competition which has resulted in a number of “rising star” young players moving interstate to pursue their ultimate goal.

VICTORIAN

2018 State Championships

51 male and 29 female teams competed in the 2018 State Championships, a decrease of 4 from 2017.

Once again there were just 3 teams in MSL1 and a combined grade of MSL1-SL2 teams played through the regular season with separate finals series for each grade.

Youth Boys (16/U) was again divided into A and B grades and once again Junior Womens (18/U) was staged as a separate grade.

Games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both MSAC and Melbourne High School.

The 15 premiership pennants were spread across 8 clubs with Melb Collegians and Footscray winning Mens and Womens SL1.

Overall it was Melb Collegians (5), Richmond (4), and 1 each to Footscray, Melb University, Monash University, NYP Dragons, Old Haileybury and St Catherines.

Melb Collegians made it back-to-back wins in MSL1 while Old Haileybury repeated as MSL6 premiers.

2019 Winter Competition

FINA's latest rule changes were adopted for this Winter season including a "training session" games to give teams - and referees - the opportunity to play under and adapt to the new rule interpretations.

WPV's supplier, Blue Vane, upgraded scoreboards at all venues to cater for the 20-30 second shot-clock changes.

3 grades had just 3 team entries – MSL1, MSL3 and Jnr Women again - so combined again grades again – MSL1-2, MSL3-4 and WSL2-JnrW – with separate finals per grade.

Total number of teams dropped to 75 - 51 male and 24 female – quite a loss of teams particularly females.

Games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both MSAC and Melbourne High School.

A survey of teams after last year's Winter season showed playing Tuesday Womens competitions indoors with later start and finish times was not popular. Games at MSAC for 2019 were therefore moved back outdoors.

8 clubs again shared the medals - Melb Collegians (6), Richmond (2), Footscray (2), Essendon, Melbourne Surge, Melbourne University, Old Melburnians, St Catherines.

Congratulations to all grade premiers - results are listed later in this report.

2018-2019 Sub-Junior Competition

Team numbers decreased to 28 this season down by 2 - 10 in 12/U Mixed, 6 in 14/U Girls and 12 in 14/U Boys (4 A-grade, 8 B-grade). Geelong Marlins were back again this time with 2 teams in the 12/Under competition and again played "double header" games every 2nd weekend.

Northcote Aquatic has over 30 young players in their water polo squad and were invited to play 12/Under "scratch" games to give them a "taste" of competition. Hopefully a club will be established there this year and we'll see Northcote teams in 2019 competition. The majority of games were played at Hawthorn Aquatic and Melb High School with rounds also at Kardinia Aquatic in Geelong, MSAC and Maribyrnong Aquatic.

Gold-Silver-Bronze medals were presented in the 14/U grades. Melb Collegians, Richmond Cubs and Essendon took the gold in Boys A, Boys B and Girls grades.

There was again no competition ladder nor finals playoffs for 12/U teams with all players presented with small pennants which again proved popular.

WPV thanks everyone in the Sub-Junior community for their help with table duties etc and their attendance at each venue. Thanks also to all our younger developing referees for their time and effort and to those senior referees who took on the mentoring role.

Tribunal Reports

Since the Judiciary Policy was revised in 2016, the number of reportable incidents has decreased markedly in State Championships hopefully reflecting players awareness of the higher penalties and the 2 year "carry-forward" clauses.

Violence/Brutality accounted for the majority of reports with referees drawing a tougher line on such offences.

REFEREE'S REPORT

General

During the 2018/19 financial year, there have been two major WPV competitions completed:

- The 2018 WPV State Championships
- The 2019 WPV Winter Competition, and
- The 12&U and 14&U Sunday competition that runs from October to March each year.

The current 2019 WPV State Championships are about to complete Round 9 of 15 pre-final rounds before the two-week recess for the term 3 holidays.

The referees available for these competitions number **84** (Appendix, Table 1 and up from 71 in 2017/18).

There are around 8 new school-age referees now refereeing at the GSV and WPV Junior Sunday competition when compared with 2017/18. This is a direct result of the WPV referees course run by Michael DeFina in May this year.

It still takes some time to appoint two referees for every game at Club level and relies heavily of a small number of referees devoting two or even three nights a week to each referee 3-4 games per night.

During 2018/19, we have seen this burden shared more between Alby Morrison, Danny Flahive, David Smyth, Charlie Dane (Moved to Canberra early 2019), Alon Pfau, Steve Wight, Spence Mitchell, Matthew Lea, Brett Knowles, Dale Anderson and Marcus Jones.

The actual number of referees regularly available (Appendix, Table 2) number around 42 per Round (36 in 2016/17).

The continued availability of senior referees such as Michael McNeill, John Mason, Garry Rydberg and Michael DeFina remains a significant positive for the refereeing body.

Senior Referees

Danny Flahive continues to be the inspirational figurehead of Victorian water polo refereeing. His run as the premier Australian referee has been continually valuable to WPV and its refereeing group. He regularly provides the latest interpretations from an international perspective on his returns for trips away with Australian teams.

Our team of referees continues to perform well. We have had referees work at various under-age National Club tournaments: including Charlie Dane, Gareth Hunter, Alon Pfau, Steve Wight, Will Ness, Adam and Ambrose Mills.

The State has also been represented at these National events with some of our senior referees acting as Technical Delegates or Tournament Directors (Danny Flahive, Michael McNeill, Alby Morrison and David Smyth).

Cade Logan is a bright prospect for higher level refereeing, but is currently playing in Montenegro after completing his VCE in 218.

This means there are approximately **15** top grade referees available for refereeing MSL1 or WSL1 at present (16 in 2016/17). However, the reality continues with people's time demands for family and employment always coming before night-time refereeing. To cover the hardest games on each of the three competition nights, there needs to be at least four of these referees available.

An increasing number of lower Grade players have been prepared to put their hands up for refereeing; many offering to referee on nights in addition to when they play. This continues to be the underlying way that the busy Thursday night WPV game schedule is covered.

Referee Pay and Assessment

With the reconfiguring of the WPV Referee pay scale and a new Referee Ranking system put fully into place during the 2018 Winter Competition, there is more incentive for Referees to improve their ranking as well as enjoy increased remuneration.

During the time relevant to this report, ten referees have gained a lift in ranking and pay (four in the 2018/19 report). This has been done by using the WPV specific referee assessment sheet (Appendix 3) that ties in with the state's 10 level referee ranking system. This is based on the assessment criteria developed and promoted by WPA.

Junior Referees

There are currently at least **12** school-age referees who are officiating at either WPV Club games (from Youth to occasional SL2 grades) or WPV under-age/Inter-school competitions (**10** in 2018/19). All of these young people show real potential and are being mentored as much as possible by more experienced referees.

The various inter-school competitions and Under-Age WPV weekend competitions are a significant pathway with which to blood our younger referees.

Pathways available

1. WPV pathways – after the work done on the new WPV referee ranking system along with the improved pay rates and scales, all WPV referees now have a clear pathway to use for their refereeing advancement.
2. The first Australian Youth Championships for under-age Club teams was run by WPA in Brisbane during January 2019. It was judged a significant success and is on again January 11-25 2020 in Brisbane. Not many WPV referees made the 2019 AYC and it is hoped that this can be significantly increase in 2020.
3. It is critical that WPV publicises the WPA requests for referees at the 2020 January tournament. Junior and senior referees should be approaching clubs to be there nominated team referee for the AYCf

Benefits include:

- improvements for WPV (and WPA) refereeing standards;
- clear subsequent pathways for referees; and
- flights, accommodation paid for as well as a per diem allowance for individual referees.

Regular Referee seminars

The 2019 Referees course run by Michael DeFina was well attended and long-overdue. It is suggested these be run annually leading into the Winter Comp, for example around March/April/May.

New FINA rules – November 2018

These encompassed significant changes to the game. Thanks to Danny Flahive, WPV was clearly ahead of the pack in implementing these for the annual Winter Competition. Of significant value was the fortuitous practice round before the school holidays. Danny Flahive and David Smyth ran 3 briefings a night (Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday) before each bracket of games. Then the rules were applied during the 9 Rounds of games.

All this meant the annual State Championships saw the 15 rounds plus finals all run with the new rules, including the updated interpretations that came out of the July FINA World Champs where Danny was the Australian representative referee.

Criticism of referees

WPV continues to receive some anecdotal criticism around the number and quality of referees. The figures given in this report indicate that numbers continue to increase, and with assessment now seen as part of the referee structure, improvement can be both monitored and rewarded.

The writer of this report continues to believe that the quality of WPV refereeing has significantly lifted over the last few seasons and that this is especially noticeable in the greater depth of referees available to control the higher-level games within the competitions.

- Note 1.**
- a. Income Tax**
The entity is exempt from Income Tax.
 - b. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**
Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.
The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.
Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements..
 - c. Impairment of Assets**
At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.
 - e. Provisions**
Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period..
 - f. Cash on Hand**
Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.
 - g. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**
Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.
 - h. Revenue and Other Income**
Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.
 - i.** Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.
Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.
 - j.** If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.
All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.
 - k. Goods and Services Tax (GST)**
Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement..
 - l. Accounts Payable and Other Payables**
Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
- Note 2.** An amount of \$6,825.50 received as a refund during 2018 was incorrectly recorded as income during 2018. This was subsequently adjusted. The effect of this adjustment is that income for 2018 was reduced by \$6,825.50 and retained earnings at the end of the year were reduced by \$6,825.50.
