PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to present the 2017/2018 Water Polo Victoria (WPV) Annual Report.

It has been a year of building and change.

Some of our key achievements include:

- delivering strong competition calendar including the introduction of Victorian Water Polo Primary and Secondary Schools competitions. We look forward to the Schools competition growing over time as further schools participate in what is now established as an important event for water polo in the State;
- creating more pathways for our athletes including the introduction of High Performance Camps and the WPV Academy of Excellence for our talented juniors. WPV is committed to supporting the Academy and growing the number of participants as the talent is identified;
- strengthening relationships with the Board and Management of Water Polo Australia (WPA) as a critical relationship for WPV;
- building on our relationship with Sport and Recreation Victoria to support the development of the sport. This relationship needs further nurturing and will hopefully develop into a stronger partnership for WPV;
- engaging with Sport Australia (formally the Australian Sports Commission) to build the profile of WPV and to better understand the direction of the sport;
- sending three State teams away to the Pan Pacific Youth Water Polo Festival in New Zealand (16/U Boys and Girls teams and 14/U Girls team). It was a good opportunity for the players to spend time together and to test themselves against strong competition;
- recognising of the importance of a Victorian AWL team as a pathway for aspiring athletes, we have been engaging with Water Polo SA to determine whether there are ways to work together to provide Victorian athletes with an additional opportunity to compete in the AWL;
- improving the governance of the sport including the introduction of three new policies - WPV Credit Policy, WPV State Team Athlete Selection Policy and WPV State Team Travel and Excursion Policy;
- hosting a Council meeting with our members. This was an important opportunity to hear collective direct feedback from the community; and
- amending the WPV Constitution, which does not currently reflect Sport Australia's Mandatory Sports Governance Principles, which impacts WPV's ability to deal with WPA, Government organisations and apply for and receive Government grants. A separate session was held with Members to talk through the proposed changes.

I would like to thank the Board for its work during the year. This included consideration of various complex issues which required significant time and focus. I would also like to thank Sally, Marni, Tony and Simon who worked extremely hard to ensure that our Association and competitions were managed in a professional manner throughout the year. I also extend a big thank you to the army of volunteers - pool controllers, referees, coaches, managers, officials, parents and the clubs - who put in such an enormous amount of time and service to support our sport. It is amazing to see the time, effort and passion that the various participants willing commit to the sport to make it a success.

Congratulations to all those members selected as State, National and Australian representatives, either as players or officials. Finally, thank you to all the players around Victoria for participating in the sport. At the end of the day, we are here to support the players and make sure we provide a safe and fun environment and provide a pathway to higher levels in the sport for those who have the passion and motivation to pursue it.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

I am again pleased to report on a progressive year for water polo in Victoria:

- At the local level the annual competitions, state championships, sub-junior, and winter competitions, have been conducted. Congratulations to all participants and the successful teams. We reintroduced a State Championship trophy, the 'Victoria Cup' for State League One Men's and Women's. It is the first trophy awarded since 1994. We also introduced the "Scarlet Blaze MVP" for State League One State Championships.
- Membership numbers increased over the last year, 1420 to 1458, with the majority coming from a Come-n-Try program in Ballarat and the Geelong Marlins-St Catherine's sub junior team.
- The Office worked closely with a small group of enthusiastic people in both Ballarat and the Morning Peninsula to assist with the development of water polo in both regions.
- The Water Polo Women (WOPOW) working group, under the guidance of Fee Harrison, continued to work on issues and initiatives aimed at encouraging more female participation across both senior and junior levels.
- At the representative level, we sent three teams to the Pan Pacific Youth Water Polo Festival in Auckland, New Zealand. The teams looked fabulous in their classic State team uniforms and did Victoria proud in the "Big V".
- We introduced the WPV Academy of Excellence, which aims to provide a "high-performance culture" and pathway for Victorian junior athletes by offering regular quality water polo training sessions each school term (i.e. two/three sessions per week each school term).
- We worked with School Sports Victoria, APS, AGSV and GSV sporting associations to host the inaugural Victorian Water Polo All Schools competition (for primary and secondary students) with a view to attracting more school-aged children into water polo. Both tournaments were a great success and we look to build on them in the coming years.
- We hosted bumpa ball, or inner tube water polo, at the Chillout Festival in Daylesford, the Victorian Teacher's Games in Ballarat, Midsumma Queer Pool Party with our partners Thorne Harbour Health, Summer BumpaBall Bash at MSAC in conjunction with Melbourne Surge and ran events for the trans gender community.
- We hosted several important events including the 2017 Finals function in conjunction with WOPOW at the George Hotel, South Melbourne, the unveiling of the Victorian Olympic Honour Board at MSAC, and the Anniversary Come and Try Night in Ballarat on February 26 to commemorate the first known women's water polo match in Australia, which occurred in Ballarat in 1886.
- In conjunction with Channel 31, WPV interviewed 15 Victorian State athletes who were competing at the 2018 Pan Pacific Youth Water Polo Festival in Auckland, New Zealand resulting in the most popular original post in 12 months. The 'Jess Loftus Pan Pacs Interview' received - 8,876 reach; 5,609 views; 783 reactions, comments and shares. We posted fixtures of State League 1, Junior and Youth competition on Facebook and Instagram and published 17 editions of the WPV Newsletter. Facebook "likes" have increased by 9% and Instagram followers have increased by 92%.
- We continue to work with our partners - Way Funky (Funky Trunks and Funkita), Ducko, EVO Sportswear, Choice Hotels and ATPI Sports Events.
- Finally, we moved to a new National online registration and competition system, Revolutionise.

I would like to acknowledge and thank Simon Armstrong, Marni Jacka and Tony Ryan without whose continued commitment, hard work and enthusiasm there would not be such a high level of quality opportunities available for the water polo community. Next year looks to be an exciting period for our sport and I look forward to continuing to work closely with the community for the common good of the sport.

COMPETITIONS' REPORT

INTERNATIONAL

A number of Victorian representative players and officials again achieved international representation over the last year including the FINA World League and World Cup tournaments and other international matches - Blake Edwards, Lachlan Edwards, Maddie Steere and Rowie Webster, Lynne Morrison (Women's Team Manager) and Daniel Flahive (Referee). A number of our younger players also gained international experience with Australian Youth teams over the last year - Harry Molnar and Max Lowe. Harry also went to the recent 2018 FINA Youth World Championship in Hungary. Two Victorians were selected in the Australian team competing at the 2017 Summer Universiade Games in Taiwan - Leo Hurley and Zoe Hille. Congratulations to all players and officials on their selection.

NATIONAL

2018 Australian Water Polo League (AWL)

Victoria did not have representative teams in this competition in 2018. After raising concerns with Sport Australia (formally the Australian Sports Commission) regarding the termination of the licence agreement between Water Polo Australia (WPA) and the Victorian Seals, the Victorian Seals and WPV have recently resolved this dispute amicably with WPA. WPV and WPA are now jointly committed to working together to build upon development pathways in Victoria.

2018 Southern Cross League

Another semi-National competition was launched in 2018 featuring teams from ACT, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania and Victoria. Melbourne Collegians entered a Men's team and Richmond entered a Men's and Women's team. All had successful seasons in the new league with Melbourne Collegians winning the Men's premiership and Richmond winning the Women's premiership. Congratulations to both clubs on their wins.

VICTORIAN

2017 State Championships

Fifty six male and 29 female teams competed in the 2017 State Championships, an increase of five from 2016. It was disappointing to see only three teams entered in MSL1 but pleasing to see clubs and teams embracing a combined MSL1-SL2 competition with separate finals series for each grade. Youth Boys (16/U) was again divided into A and B grades, and an increased number of teams saw the Junior Women's (18/U) return to State Championships as a separate grade after a number of years playing in WLS2. Venues were MSAC and Melbourne High School with games played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both venues. The 15 premiership pennants were spread across eight clubs with Melbourne Collegians and NYP Dragons winning Men's and Women's SL1. Overall it was Melbourne Collegians (7), La Trobe University (2), DVE Aquatic, Melbourne University, Monash University, NYP Dragons, Old Haileybury and Old Ivanhoe Vikings. It was Old Haileybury's first State Championships pennant while Ivanhoe Vikings made it back-to-back winning MSL5 after their MSL6 success last year.

2018 Winter Competition

While clubs have for some time been calling for some form of change for the Winter competition, the modified "continuous play" rules introduced for this season were not popular with players. Nevertheless, teams and players completed the season with minimal fallout. For the current 2018 State Championships, competition has returned to full FINA rules. Despite once again having only three team in MSL1, 85 teams competed in the 2018 Winter Competition season - 55 male and 30 female. Again, there were 15 grades including A and B for Youth Boys. Games were played on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights at both MSAC and Melbourne High School. The Tuesday Women's competitions were again indoors at MSAC but support waned due to the later start and post 10.00pm finishing times. Continuing to play indoors will be reviewed for the 2019 competition. Having to play late games (9.30pm start) on Tuesday and Thursday nights creates logistical problems for our referee rostering and for MSAC staff with increased costs incurred for finishing after MSAC's official closing time (10.00pm). With pool capacity at the maximum, just one extra team could "tip us over the edge". Nine clubs shared the gold medals - Melbourne Collegians (5), NYP Dragons and DVE Aquatic (2), Essendon, La Trobe University, Melbourne University, Old Melburnians, Richmond and Ringwood. Congratulations to all grade premiers.

Tribunal Reports

The new Judiciary Policy introduced in October 2016 has seen a slight decrease in the number of reportable incidents and a very sharp increase in penalties reflecting the intent of the new policy. Charges relating to Disrespect have decreased but Violence/Brutality are higher with referees drawing a tougher line on such offences. Hopefully the message is getting players to curtail their behaviour particularly to avoid any “carry-forward” additional penalty.

2017-2018 Sub-Junior Competition

Once again teams numbers increased for this competition. Teams numbered 30 - 13 in 12/U Mixed, 6 14/U Girls and 11 14/U Boys (4 A-grade, 7 B-grade). We welcomed a combined Geelong Marlins- St Catherine’s team who ventured up the highway every second weekend taking on their city rivals in “double header” games. Their enthusiasm was great to see and they were by far the best dressed team in the competition – great effort by parents and the team manager. All 12/U and 14/U participants were presented with a player pack which included a small shoulder bag, a Mikasa mini-ball and a Parents’ Handbook – the mini-ball being very popular. The majority of games were played at Hawthorn Aquatic and Melbourne High School, with Maribyrnong Aquatic and Watermarc in Greensborough also hosting a few rounds. Again, there was no competition ladder or finals playoffs for 12/U teams with all players presented with small pennants which again proved popular. Gold-Silver-Bronze medals were presented in the 14/U grades. Melbourne Collegians (2) and DVE Aquatic (1) took the gold in these grades.

WPV thanks everyone in the Sub-Junior community for their help with table duties, etc., and their attendance at each venue. Thanks also to all our younger developing referees for their time and effort and to those senior referees who took on the mentoring role.

Pool Space

Acquiring pool space for our competitions is an ongoing struggle with sometimes ridiculously high hire costs being quoted for 25m x 8 lane space particularly through the summer months. Unless WPV can find a dedicated water polo pool managed by WPV, access to pool space will always be a challenge.

Acknowledgments

WPV enjoys excellent relationships with management and aquatics staff at all our venues - MSAC, Melbourne High School and Hawthorn Aquatic. Their cooperation and efforts in working with us enables us to meet our needs for both competition and training – often against numerous similar and conflicting requests from other aquatics organisations.

Thanks to our dedicated band of Pool Controllers and regular referees who support our competitions week-in, week-out. Special mention to David Smyth who has the challenging and time-consuming task of trying to cover all games where possible with two referees – something not always achievable. Great work David. And to the families who enthusiastically crowd the pool decks at Hawthorn and Melbourne High supporting our junior players – it provides a great atmosphere – well done all.

REFEREE'S REPORT

During the 2017/18 financial year, there have been two major WPV competitions completed - the 2017 WPV State Championships and the 2018 WPV Winter Competition. The referees used for these competitions number 71, which is up from 62 in 2016/17. The competition still struggles to appoint two referees for every game and relies heavily on a small number of referees devoting two or even three nights a week, with each referee overseeing three to five games per night. Alby Morrison has long held the mantle of greatest contributing referee in terms of three nights per week as well as doing the majority of Pool Control shifts. During 2017/18, we have seen this burden shared more between Alby, Danny Flahive, David Smyth, Charlie Dane, Alon Pfau, Steve Wight, Matthew Lea, Brett Knowles, Dale Anderson and Marcus Jones. We were pleased to welcome back Steve Wight after a two years hiatus, as well as Kieran Hattie. Continued effort is needed to expand the numbers in this team. The actual number of referees regularly available is 36 per round (30 in 2016/17). The continued availability of senior referees such as Michael McNeill, John Mason and Michael DeFina remains a significant positive for the refereeing body. Danny Flahive continues to be the inspirational figurehead of Victorian water polo refereeing. His run as the premier Australian referee has been happily extended with FINA lifting their referee retirement age to 60. We of course believe this is a Danny Flahive lead extension as he is so valued at the international level. The State has also been represented at National events with some of our senior referees acting as Technical Delegates or Tournament Directors (Danny Flahive, Michael McNeill, Alby Morrison and David Smyth).

Our team of younger referees continues to perform well. We have had referees work at various under-age National Club tournaments: including Charlie Dane, Gareth Hunter, Will Ness, Adam and Ambrose Mills. Charlie and Gareth each gained finals appointments at these events. We have welcomed Harry Lovelock back from his time in the UK, and despite his Melbourne Uni rugby demands, he has impressed poolside as one of our promising junior referees. Cade Logan is preoccupied with his Year 12 studies, but we look forward to 2019 when his refereeing should move to a higher level along with his national under-age selections.

An increasing number of lower grade players have been prepared to put their hands up for refereeing; many offering to referee on nights in addition to when they play. This continues to be the underlying way that the busy Thursday night WPV game schedule is covered.

With the reconfiguring of the WPV referee pay scale and a new Referee Ranking System put fully into place during the 2018 Winter Competition, there is more incentive for referees to improve their ranking as well as enjoy increased remuneration. To date, four referees have gained a lift in ranking and pay, and it is hoped that more take advantage of this process.

Pathways available

1. WPV pathways – after the work done on the new WPV referee ranking system along with the improved pay rates and scales, all WPV referees now have a clear pathway to use for their refereeing advancement.
2. WPA pathways – for about the last 10 years or so, WPA has run all national under-age club championships around the various national school holidays. From 2019, all age groups will be run during January in a super-tournament format held in Brisbane for 2019 and 2020.

WPV needs to continue to be proactive in encouraging promising younger referees to attend these tournaments. Benefits include:

- improvements for WPV (and WPA) refereeing standards;
- clear subsequent pathways for referees; and
- flights, accommodation paid for as well as a per diem allowance for individual referees.

Criticism

WPV continues to receive some anecdotal criticism around the number and quality of referees. The figures given in this report indicate that numbers are slowly increasing, and with assessment now seen as part of the referee structure, improvement can be both monitored and rewarded. I believe that the quality of WPV refereeing has significantly lifted over the last few seasons and that this is especially noticeable in the greater depth of referees available to control the higher-level games within the competitions.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 June 2018

a. Income Tax

The entity is exempt from Income Tax.

b. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

e. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f. Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

g. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

h. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

i. Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

j. If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

k. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

l. Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
